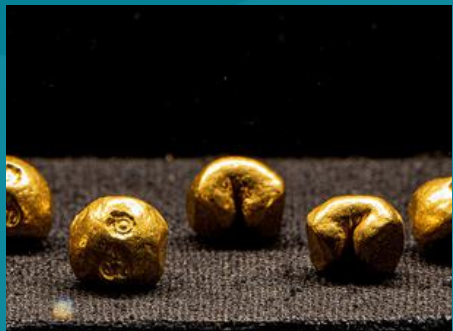

BANGLAMPHU MUSEUM

Bang Lamphu Museum is a community learning center operated by the Treasury Department. Her Royal Highness Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn officially opened it on August 21, 2015. The museum's site was originally the home of Phraya Noranart Bhakdisriratsakorn, Director-General of the Treasury Department during the reign of King Rama V. It was later adapted for various uses, including storage, textbook sales, the Wat Sangwet Printing School, and the Kurusapha Printing House.

Currently housed in the Royal Thai Government and managed by the Treasury Department, Ministry of Finance, the museum displays information on the five main missions of the Treasury Department, as well as important historical developments of the Bang Lamphu community from the beginning of the Rattanakosin era to the present day.

NATIONAL MUSEUM BANGKOK

The Bangkok National Museum is the first national museum in Thailand. It is located in the Phra Nakhon district of Bangkok, within the grounds of the Front Palace, which was the royal residence of the Crown Prince from the reign of King Rama I onwards. Originally, this site housed many important national artifacts, most notably the Ram Khamhaeng Inscription, which has been declared a Memory of the World heritage site.



The first museum in Thailand was established by King Mongkut, who founded a private museum. Later, during the reign of King Chulalongkorn, he graciously ordered the establishment of a national museum, which is now the National Museum Bangkok. The National Museum Bangkok is considered the first public museum in Thailand, built in 1859 to display information on history, art history, archaeology, and ethnology.

SUPREME PATRIARCH (PHAETISSADEVAMAHATHERA) RESIDENCE MUSEUM, WAT SUTHAT

Originally, this was the residence of Somdej Phra Ariyavongsakhatayan (Pae Tissadevamaha Thera), the 4th abbot of Wat Suthat, from 1900 onwards. He was later appointed as the 12th Supreme Patriarch of Bangkok (1938-1944). He played a significant role in promoting the translation of the Tripitaka into Thai. The house was also the residence of several former abbots dating back to the reign of King Rama III, resulting in the temple accumulating a large collection of antiques, totaling over 20,000 items. Later, restoration and cataloging of the antiques were undertaken to open a museum, a project that took approximately 10 years.¹⁰



The museum was officially opened on December 6, 2024, with the primary objective of serving as a learning center for Buddhism, history, and culture, as well as honoring the late King. Spanning 1,788 square meters, the space is divided into five rooms: The Royal Residence: displaying the King's biography, personal belongings, and Buddhist art created by his own hands.

ROYAL BARGES NATIONAL MUSEUM

The National Museum of Royal Barges was originally a dock or storage facility for royal barges, under the care of the Royal Household and the Royal Thai Navy. During World War II, the dock and some of the royal barges were bombed and damaged. In 1947, the Royal Household and the Royal Thai Navy entrusted the Fine Arts Department with the repair and maintenance of these royal barges. Royal barges are historically significant vessels, renowned for their exquisite craftsmanship and artistic value. Importantly, they continue to be used in various royal ceremonies to this day. Recognizing their importance, the Fine Arts Department registered the various royal barges as national heritage and elevated the dock to the status of the National Museum of Royal Barges in 1974.

BANGKOK CITY LIBRARY



The Bangkok City Library is a public library under the care of the Bangkok Metropolitan Administration (BMA). Originally, the building was a historic structure built around 1939-1948 by the architect Chitsen Abhayawong. The project to create a public library for the city was one of the policies stemming from UNESCO's selection of Bangkok as the World Book Capital in 2013. The BMA leased this building from the Crown Property Bureau and undertook renovations, preserving the original architectural style and designing the interior to harmonize with the surrounding atmosphere.

THE CONSTITUTIONAL COURT MUSEUM

Inside the Constitutional Court Museum, exhibits showcase the history of the monarchy and important figures associated with the Constitutional Court, such as photographs of His Majesty King Bhumibol Adulyadej the Great, granted royal audiences.



On Wednesday, May 6, 1998, the President of the Constitutional Court led the first group of Constitutional Court judges to an audience to take an oath before assuming office. The royal portrait of His Majesty the King, while he was Crown Prince, was taken together with the Constitutional Court judges on the occasion of representing His Majesty the King to officially open the House of Chao Phraya Rattanathibet as the Constitutional Court headquarters on Friday, November 17, 2000. The display of various objects.



Examples include the symbolic hammer of the Constitutional Court discovered within the residence of Chao Phraya Rattanathibet during the restoration of the Constitutional Court, and the sculpture of the Constitution Guardian. The exhibition showcases the political and governmental history related to the constitution from the past to the present, displays real cases adjudicated by the Constitutional Court, and recreates court proceedings using modern multimedia to provide a realistic experience. There is also an exhibition highlighting the relationship between the Constitutional Court of Thailand and constitutional courts worldwide, demonstrating international cooperation, as well as an exhibition on the history of the Chao Phraya Rattanathibet residence located in the old community along Khlong Ong Ang (or the canal surrounding Bangkok), and the transformation of lifestyles from water to land transportation.

BANK OF THAILAND LEARNING CENTER



The Bank of Thailand Learning Center was originally the first banknote printing factory in Thailand, established through the ingenuity of Thai people. It symbolizes the nation's commitment to technological development. Inside the factory is a secure vault, previously used to store the country's banknotes – a restricted area. This building holds significant historical importance, being over 50 years old, yet its structure remains strong and its architecture is remarkably beautiful, featuring a unique curved concrete roof, the only one of its kind remaining in Thailand.

PHYATHAI PALACE

Phaya Thai Palace, or Wang Phaya Thai, is located on the banks of Khlong Sam Sen, on Ratchawithi Road, Thung Phaya Thai Subdistrict, Ratchathewi District, Bangkok. King Chulalongkorn (Rama V) ordered its construction and named it "Phaya Thai Palace" or "Wang Phaya Thai." Later, it was elevated to the status of Phaya Thai Palace during the reign of King Vajiravudh (Rama VI). Currently, only one building remains: the Thewarat Sapharom Throne Hall, constructed during the reign of Rama V. Other buildings constructed during the reign of Rama VI include the Waikun Thep Yasathan Throne Hall, the Phiman Chakri Throne Hall, the Sri Sutthawas Throne Hall, the Udom Wanaphon Throne Hall, the Mekhala Rujie Palace, the Roman Garden, and the Shrine of Thao Hiranyaphanasur. The names of the throne halls are chosen to have a rhyming effect: Waikun Thep Yasathan, Phiman Chakri, Sri Sutthawas, Thewarat Sapharom, and Udom Wanaphon. The distinctive architectural feature of Phaya Thai Palace is the tall tower and pointed roof of the Phiman Chakri Throne Hall. The interior features beautiful Western-style fresco paintings.

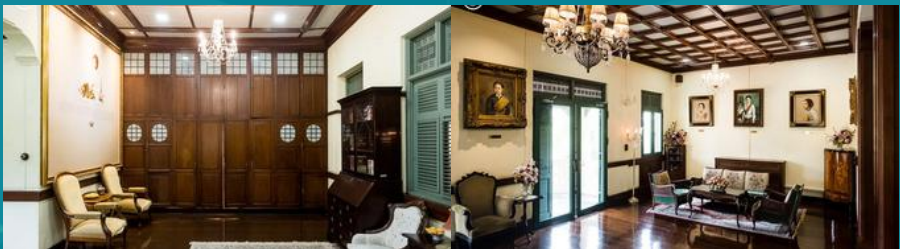

The museum's exhibits include postal weighing scales. The museum is divided into four sections: Permanent Exhibition and Collection Area: Presents the history of Thai postal services and early stamps. 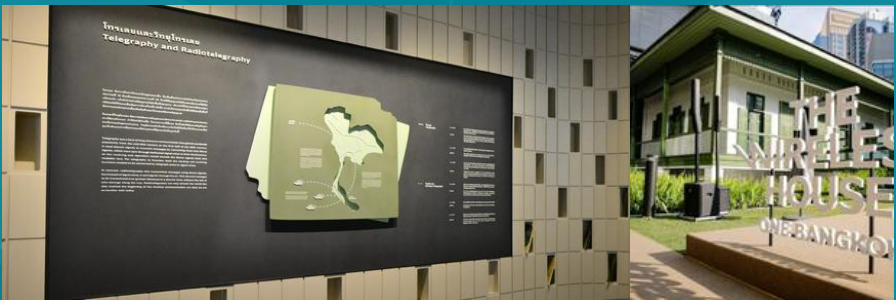

THE NATIONAL MEMORIAL

The National Monument is a project proposed by the Ministry of Defense to the Cabinet as part of the celebration of the 200th anniversary of Rattanakosin. PHUKET THAIHUA MUSEUM

From the first Chinese language school in Phuket to becoming a museum created by the descendants of Hokkien Chinese, who once studied at this school, they have worked together to establish it. The museum gathers the history of Phuket from the past to the present and serves as a memorial reminding everyone of the virtues of the ancestors who left good deeds for the current generation. The Phuket Thai Hua Museum building features Sino-Portuguese architecture, built in 1934, and has been restored to a pristine and elegant condition, serving as a community learning center. The upper floor is used as a Chinese language classroom, while the lower floor consists of various rooms with exhibitions divided into 13 sections. These exhibitions showcase the history of the Hokkien Chinese who traveled to Phuket, their beliefs, lifestyle, traditions, arts, and culture, as well as the relationship between the Chinese and Phuket residents, and the history of the Thai Hua Chinese Language School, which has been teaching for over 60 years. These exhibitions are made interesting through the use of modern multimedia, making them enjoyable and easy to understand, suitable for visitors of all ages. Additionally, it is also a venue for various interesting cultural and artistic activities, such as the Moon Festival and Baba Wedding.

1. Phuket Nakhon (PHUKETNAGARA): This building, once a police station, narrates the origin of Phuket City through its development across four eras (forest, mining, urban, and tourism). "Tin" played a crucial role in the city's foundation, attracting people of various nationalities and languages seeking "wealth" continuously. It offers educational activities that make learning about these stories enjoyable.

Peranakan Exhibition: Housed in the former Charter Bank building, this exhibition tells the story of the lifestyle and culture of the Peranakan people. It explores who the Peranakan are and where they originated from.

CHINPRACHA HOUSE & MUSEUM PHUKET



Visit the old Sino-European style house, the first of its kind built on Phuket Island, over 100 years old. Located on Krabi Road, Talat Nuea Subdistrict, in Phuket Town, it is the residence of the Tantavanich family. The owner has preserved the building and its furnishings remarkably well. This house is also known as "Ang Mo Lao," built during the reign of King Rama V by Phraya Pitak Chinpracha (Tan Ma Siang), a Hokkien Chinese immigrant whose family engaged in tin mining on the island and traded with Penang. They are the ancestors of the "Tantavanich" lineage. The Chinpracha House is a two-story building, distinguished by its louvered wooden windows and gilded doors. The house has an open center to allow cool air circulation, featuring a small pond in the middle, reflecting traditional Chinese house-building principles. This house is lavishly decorated, with Italian tiles flooring, antique Chinese furniture, some inlaid with real mother-of-pearl, an ancient bed, and dining sets from Penang. Most materials in the house were imported due to the thriving maritime trade between Penang and Phuket at that time. Furthermore, there are many other valuable items, including photographs.

"This house serves as a testament to the glorious past and is considered a valuable cultural heritage that you must visit at least once when traveling to Phuket. Besides being open for tourist visits, it also serves as a center for cultural and artistic knowledge dissemination. It hosts cultural activities of Phuket, such as the Baba-Yaya wedding, which is rare to witness nowadays. Additionally, it is occasionally used as a filming location."
