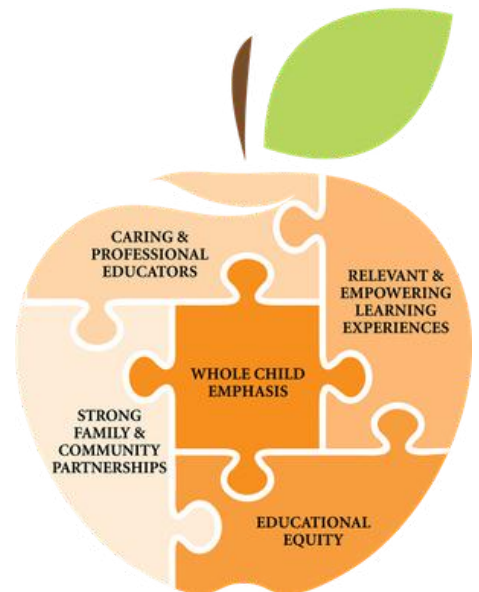

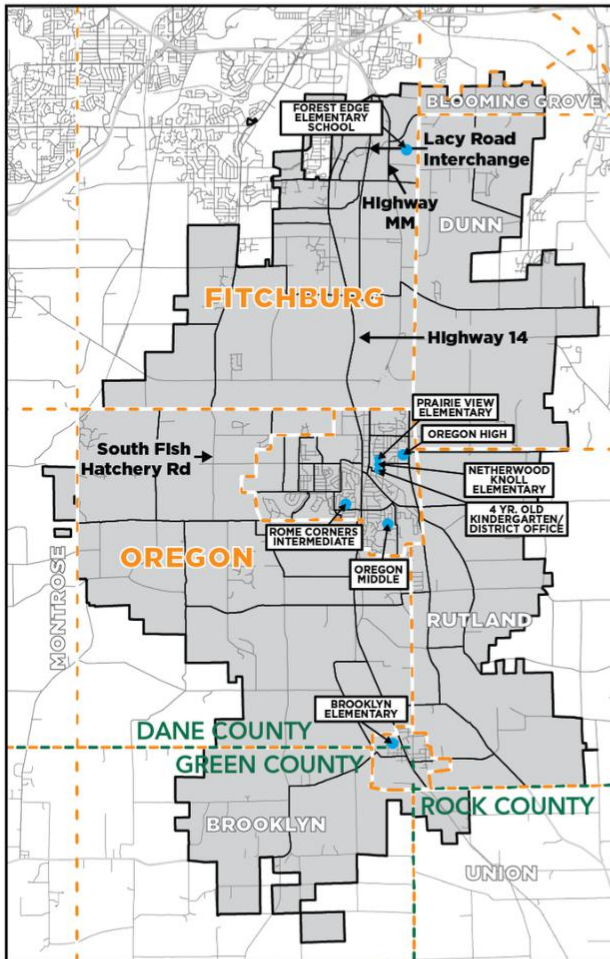

CE & Rec After-School Programs: What to Expect for Programs Beginning Between 3:00-3:30PM?

- Students will receive a blue reminder card on their **classroom door (BKE, FES, NKE, PVE)** or **locker (RCI)** each day that they have an after-school class
 - This blue reminder card will tell the students where to meet CE & Rec staff for class check-in after the school day
 - Students should bring this card with them to give to the CE & Rec staff who will be checking in the class
- CE & Rec staff will supervise students after school until the class begins
- For students who attend **NKE** or **PVE**, CE & Rec staff will walk with students between buildings depending on the location of the class being held
 - CE & Rec **DOES NOT** provide transportation between schools of any kind other than walking between **NKE** and **PVE only**
- For any student that may be arriving late due to traveling between schools for a class, CE & Rec staff will meet at the main entrance for check-in
- Please let CE & Rec know ahead of time for any absences that may occur

Scholarships

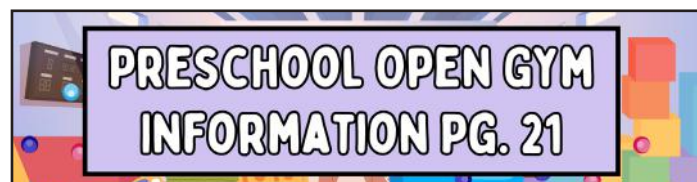

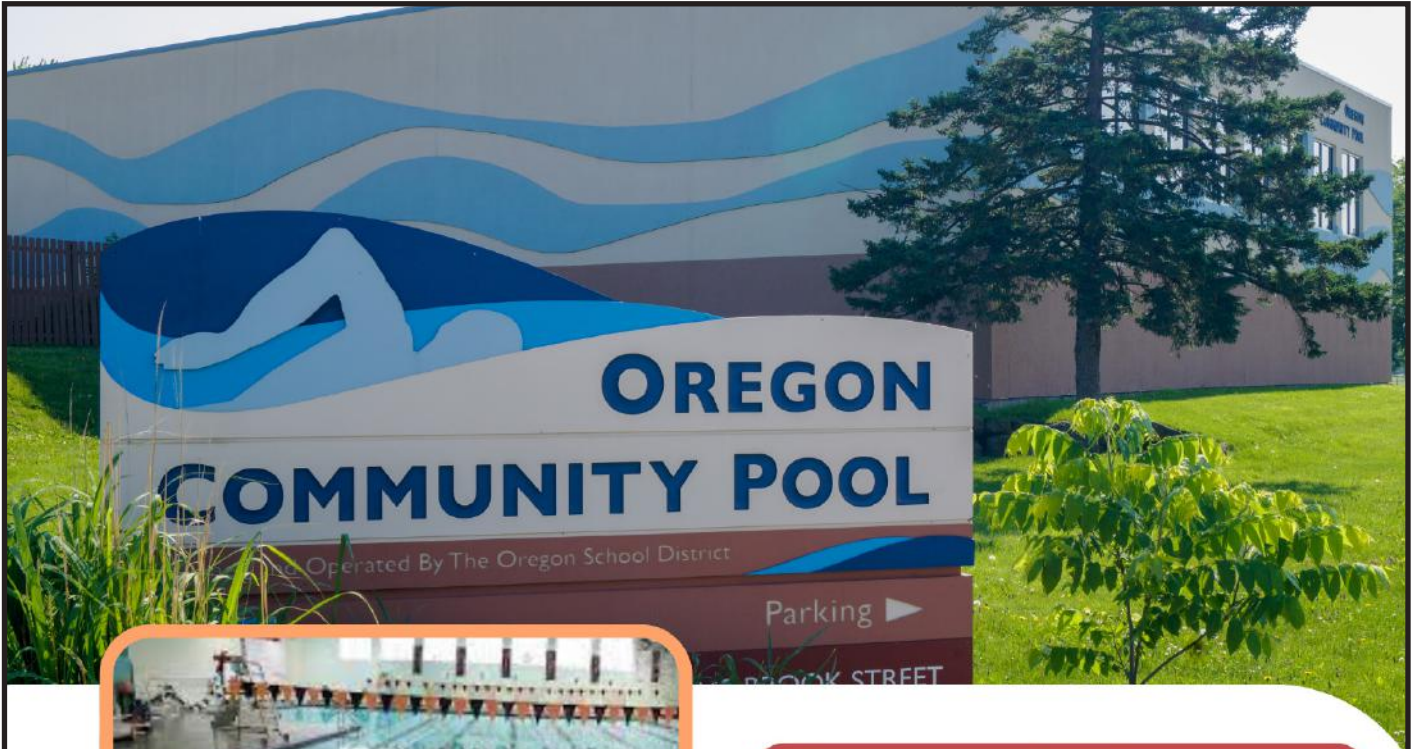

Water exercise, often referred to as aquatic exercise, involves performing physical activities in water, typically in a swimming pool. It leverages the natural resistance of water, making it an effective way to enhance strength, flexibility, and cardiovascular fitness with reduced impact on joints. We encourage our patrons to move at their own pace and modify any exercises they need to.

What are the Benefits of Water Exercise?

Resistance Training	Water provides natural resistance, which helps build muscle strength as participants push against the water while moving.
Low Impact	The buoyancy of water supports the body, reducing stress on joints and minimizing the risk of injury, making it suitable for all fitness levels.
Improved Cardiovascular Fitness	Regular aquatic workouts can enhance heart and lung function, making it a great option for cardio conditioning.
Rehabilitation	Water exercise is often used in physical therapy settings to aid recovery from injuries due to its gentle nature.
Variety of Activities	Water exercises can include aerobics, swimming, walking or jogging in water, water yoga, and water-based strength training using resistance equipment.

Levels 4A-6 focus on refining stroke techniques and building endurance by improving efficiency in freestyle, backstroke, breaststroke, and butterfly. Swimmers work on mastering proper form and increasing stamina for longer swims and more advanced techniques.

Who can use the pantry and how often?

Anyone who lives in the Oregon School District and needs assistance with food and other personal essential items may come to the pantry once a week. Use of the pantry is confidential - your information will not be shared with anyone.

What items do you have at the pantry?

The pantry regularly stocks frozen meat, fresh fruit/vegetables, canned vegetables, fruit, soups, beans and pasta sauce, peanut butter & jelly, and other canned and dried goods. The pantry usually has dairy, eggs, and other frozen or refrigerated items. The pantry tries to keep a good stock of an assortment of personal care items, such as toilet paper, paper towel, tissues, toothpaste, deodorant, shampoo, and cleaning supplies.

How do I use the pantry?

If you are new to the pantry, please bring ID for you and the members of your household as well as proof of residency in the Oregon School District. A volunteer will review the information with you. Because the pantry receives some food from a federal program, there are income guidelines for guests. You will be asked if you meet the guidelines. Even if your income is above the guidelines and you need assistance, the pantry will still serve you. Income guidelines can be found at <https://www.dhs.wisconsin.gov/library/collection/f-40059>. Every time you come to the pantry, bring your ID. If your address has changed, please bring proof of your new address. If you are unable to come to the pantry, you can have a "proxy" shop for you. You must give written permission to the proxy to shop for you.

What is the process for shopping?

The pantry is set up like a small grocery store. When you arrive, you will be given a number and when it is your turn, you will start shopping and choosing the items you need. Please bring re-usable bags or other items to carry your groceries. When you have finished shopping, pantry volunteers can help you load them into your car. If you are not able to come inside to shop, a volunteer will shop for you. You will choose items from a grocery list and they will be selected and brought to your car.

Workers aged 14-15 years can apply for work permits using a new online work permit application tool. A parent can access the site using the following website: <https://dwd.wisconsin.gov/er/laborstandards/workpermit/>. Payment is made directly to the department through the application using a credit card, debit card, or ACH direct withdrawal. Once the permit process is complete, the Department of Workforce Development will mail a paper copy of the permit directly to the employer. Children 16 and older are no longer required to get a work permit. Check with your employer for their policy. Questions? Call 835-4091.
