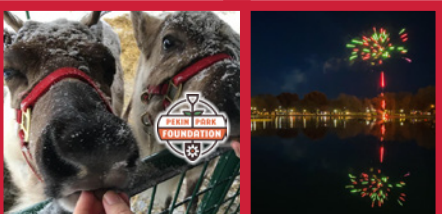

FIELD TRIP ADVENTURES

ATTENTION EDUCATORS:

Pekin Park District offers field trips to McNaughton Park where students can discover the flora and fauna of the Illinois River Valley. In each workshop, park educators introduce key concepts tied to state learning goals and present lessons through discussion, storytelling, show and tell, walks in the woods, highly engaging games, and arts and craft activities. School field trip programs are available to public, private elementary and middle schools, and home-school groups of 10 or more students. Offered September through May. Cost is \$5 per child.

AVAILABLE WORKSHOPS

Wild or Not? (Grades K – 2)

Participants will learn the differences between wild and domesticated animals, compare natural environments with man-made environments, and consider appropriate interactions between humans and wildlife.

Nature All Around (Grades K – 3)

Participants will learn that through careful observation and knowing what clues to look for, one can quickly discover a great diversity of living things. Using our senses, examining clues animals leave behind, and understanding the concept of “habitats” and what they provide will be presented through show and tell items, hiking, and hands-on activities.

Feasts, Famine, & Food Webs (Grades 4 – 7)

Examine the relationships between predators and prey, what happens when animal populations explode and crash, what makes animal food sources unstable, and the elements of an ideal balance in these interrelationships.

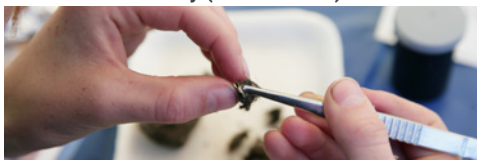

End of the Year Rewards Days (All ages)

Teachers, are you looking for a way to reward your students for their year of hard work? Rewards Day programs are three hours of activities such as a hike in the woods, team challenge games, nature art, mad scientist experiments, and simple survival skills. Pack a sack lunch.

Owl Pellet Discovery (Grades 4 – 8)



Who, who, whoo ever knew that the habits of owls could be learned in examining their pellets? In this workshop, students will have the opportunity to dismantle owl pellets to discover what surprises might be inside!

Pond Explorations (Grades 4 and up)



Water, water everywhere! Water is important for every living thing! During this program, we will look at the water cycle and talk about freshwater habitats and the creatures they support. Students will have hands-on activities that encourage them to learn about ponds and streams, and weather permitting, we will take a walk through the woods to one of McNaughton Park's streams (children may get dirty).

ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES EDUCATIONAL BACKPACK LOANER PROGRAM

Pekin Park District is pleased to be a host site for an IDNR Field Trip Pack. The Backpack Loaner Program provides educators with a multitude of outstanding resources to help prepare students for exploration of nature. They are great for formal and non-formal educators to use. Teachers, youth group leaders, scout leaders, home-schooling educators, pre-service teacher instructors, librarians, nature-center personnel, museum staff, Ag in the Classroom staff, University of Illinois Extension staff and Soil and Water Conservation District staff are just some of the people who have borrowed and used the loaner program.

*PUBLIC SKATE

(Schedules updated monthly on our website)

*FREESTYLE SESSIONS

(Schedules updated monthly on our website)

Freestyle sessions are for figure skating only. Figure skaters may work on moves-in-the-field, ice dancing, jumps, and spins. Skaters take turns playing their music as they are practicing their programs. There are higher level skaters on freestyle sessions that are moving fast and performing double and triple jumps, along with complicated footwork and dance patterns. It is important to look out for all other skaters. Due to the limited number of spots available, there are no refunds on admission fees paid online for missed sessions.

*RAT HOCKEY

(Schedules updated monthly on our website)

Rat Hockey (aka Pick-up or Open Hockey) is designated scrimmage ice time which is open to the public. Players sign up and split into teams on their own. There is no checking allowed. Players officiate themselves. Rat Hockey sessions are open to players of all skill levels and abilities in the appropriate age level for the session wishing to skate. Adult Rat Hockey is for players ages 18 and over. Players ages 16 and 17 may also skate, but they must have a parent or guardian sign the waiver for that session.



*STICK & PUCK

(Schedules updated monthly on our website)

Stick and Puck sessions are an opportunity for hockey players of all ages to practice individual hockey skills such as skating, shooting, and passing.

Stick & Puck Requirements:

- Skaters who are under 17 years of age must wear full equipment.

LEARN TO SKATE

Learn to skate with the Pekin Park District! Ice skating lessons are a great way for all ages to learn new skills and have fun. Lessons are 45 minutes long. Rental skates are included in the session price, or you can bring your own. Lessons begin September 12 and are held on Mondays at 5 p.m. and 5:45 p.m. or Saturdays at 9 a.m.



Session cost: \$80 R / \$85 NR

Level Descriptions

Tots (3-5 years): Preschool age skaters learn the fundamentals of skating to develop preliminary coordination and strength to maneuver on the ice. Skills include the correct way to fall, how to get up properly, skill-building games, basic movement on the ice, glides, dips, and swizzles.

Pre-Alpha: Beginning skaters are introduced to basic moves such as one and two-foot glides, dips, and swizzles.

Alpha: Progressively builds on the beginning basics. Skills include forward stroking, snowplow stop, forward crossovers, and backward swizzles.

Beta: Skaters learn backward stroking, backward crossovers, and T-stops.

Gamma: Moves at a faster pace and includes a combination of skills learned in Beta.

Delta: Skaters work on the positioning, techniques, and speed that form the foundation for jumps. Delta skaters also learn inside three turns, edges, shoot the duck, lunges, and bunny hops.

Jump and Spin: Skaters learn a progression of jumps, spins, and advanced combinations.

Team: Skaters build strength, develop artistry on the ice, and learn choreography for performance and competitions. Participants must also register for at least one Learn to Skate class per session. Final session of the season will end with an Ice Show for all skaters to participate.

LITTLE STARS HOCKEY

Our popular Little Stars Hockey program is designed for the youngest hockey star hopefuls ages 3 to 5. Little Stars works on the fundamental skills of hockey: power skating, stick handling, passing, shooting, and most importantly, sportsmanship and team play. No prior skating experience is necessary. Our coaching staff has many years of hockey experience as former players and coaches.
