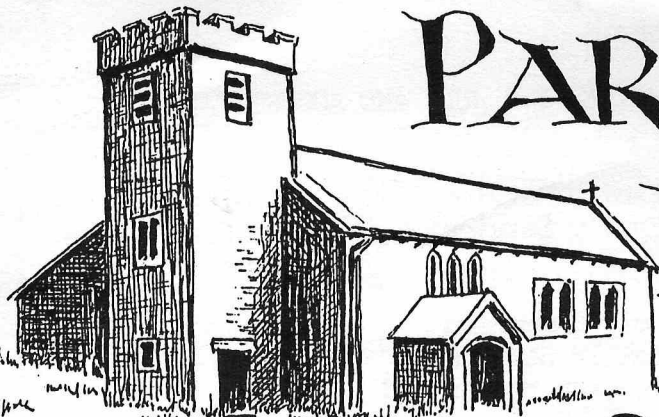


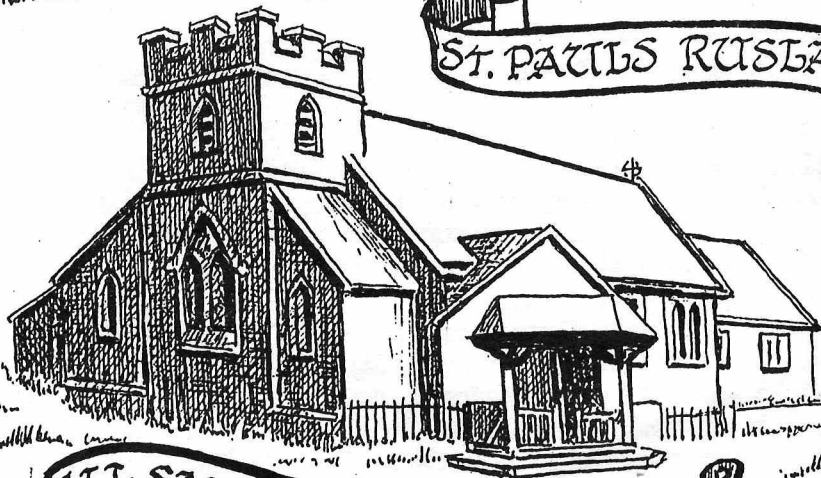

COLTON NOTES

Sheila Wareham has been away with her daughter in the South and sadly she and her family are all most unwell with sudden sickness. As a result there is no letter from Sheila this month.

Florence Enid Barwell died on 13 June aged 94. She married George in 1927, they came to live at Snows in 1943. During the war she taught at her Uncle's Boys' School. Later she and George started the "Young Villagers" in Bouth. She became a Guide Commissioner. She never lost her special interest in the young. Colton Church was perhaps the Barwell's greatest love. The social side was important, for instance the wonderful Tombolas they ran at the annual garden party. But above all Enid will be remembered with gratitude for the efficient way she acted as PCC Secretary for many years. And also her devoted and talented editorship of the Parish Magazine. Her high standards, scholarship and knowledge of the bible were put to good use. It was wonderful that she was able to be cared for in her own home in the 4 months after George died. We extend our sympathy to her relatives and to Mrs Lambert who gave so much help to the Barwells over so many years. The funeral was taken by the Rev Fred Hambrey and the organ was played by the Rev Derek Tinsley. Friends were invited to give donations to the Church in her memory.

All in Bouth were saddened to learn of the death of Bob Hall whilst playing bowls on Sunday afternoon 5 June. Bob and Betty came to the Old School House 26 years ago from Chester-le-Street, Co Durham. The memorial service at Colton, followed by cremation was taken by the Rev Sheila Wareham, and was

attended by family and his many friends from Bouth and the bowling fraternity. We extend our love and sympathy to Betty at this sad time. Betty would like to thank all friends and neighbours for their sympathy and loving support received during her sudden loss, for the many letters and cards of condolence and for donations to Colton Church and the Rev Sheila Wareham for her kind ministrations.
