

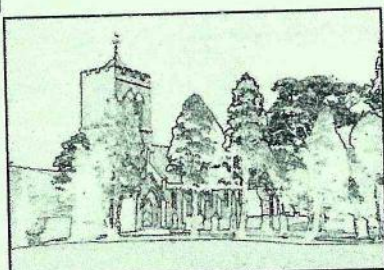

Pastoral Letter - February 2019

Following retirement from full time ministry I have had chance to re-acquaint myself with attending regular worship as a member of a congregation. In the early days of visiting each of the churches in our joint benefice, I scanned the walls to read the memorials and plaques commemorating the great and the good of each parish.

Such memorials remind us we build upon the work of those who have gone before us. In each of our churches successive generations of Christians have responded to the need to own Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour and, as a result, to grow in the knowledge of the Christian faith, to witness to the community in which God had placed them and to share God's overflowing love with those in need.

In turn, we who currently sit in the pews each week, are exposed to the same call from God: to own Jesus Christ as our personal Lord and Saviour and then once His, to grow in the knowledge of our faith, to witness to the community in which He has placed us and to care for others as an expression of God's all-encompassing love.

Whatever the changes and chances of the world, whatever the world's view of the church may be; no matter how good or not so good the witness of the previous generation, we, this generation of Christians, have been chosen by God to fulfil our calling to grow, to witness and to care, all in the Name of the one who died and rose again, Jesus Christ our Lord and Saviour. The call is all-inclusive, no exceptions; each Christian is called, equipped and given opportunity to fulfil their God-given calling both individually and corporately.

To grow in the knowledge of our faith will generate assurance, challenges and revelations. As we grow in our understanding our view of the world, of each other and ourselves, will align with that of God.

To witness to our community will produce surprises as we experience just what God can achieve through us. Witnessing will also bring opportunities, strengthening and testing, revealing the value we place upon the message we have received.

To care with the compassion that our Father shows us will foster compassion, stir up empathy, create time and develop prayer.

If we rise to answer His call, if we continue to serve the Lord and His people in this way, we will ensure, when successive generations look back on our efforts, they will say that we were faithful to our calling and in turn be encouraged by our example.

If we decline to heed His call then future generations will say we were no more than caretakers of buildings which we used for our own purposes, and as a result, eventually became museums.

All God asks of us is to be faithful, to take up His call, to rely upon Him for our inspiration, guidance and strength. If we do, we will not find Him wanting as countless generations of saints of old bear witness.

May the same be said of us..

Getting to know Jesus better...

This month we are continuing to look at John, chapter 4

English Standard Version of the Bible

Notes by Matt Rich, pastor of Bethany Christian Church, Ulverston

Meanwhile the disciples were urging him, saying, "Rabbi, eat." But he said to them, "I have food to eat that you do not know about." So the disciples said to one another, "Has anyone brought him something to eat?"

Jesus said to them, "My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to accomplish his work. Do you not say, 'There are yet four months, then comes the harvest'? Look, I tell you, lift up your eyes, and see that the fields are white for harvest. Already the one who reaps is receiving wages and gathering fruit for eternal life, so that sower and reaper may rejoice together. For here the saying holds true, 'One sows and another reaps.' I sent you to reap that for which you did not labour. Others have laboured, and you have entered into their labour."

Jesus wasn't really saying to them that he didn't need food to eat - he was trying to get them to see that some things in life are more satisfying than focusing on bodily needs like food.

What really satisfies you? Is it when you have eaten a good meal? Is it when you feel good about yourself for making someone else happy? - None of these things are wrong in themselves, but Jesus wants us all to realise that the thing that is most important in life and most satisfying is following God and doing what He wants rather than just what we feel like doing!

Jesus is also explaining to them that His followers are a team - everyone plays an important part in achieving the final goal.

Many Samaritans from that town believed in him because of the woman's testimony, "He told me all that I ever did." So when the Samaritans came to him, they asked him to stay with them, and he stayed there two days.

And many more believed because of his word. They said to the woman, "It is no longer because of what you said that we believe, for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is indeed the Savior of the world."

After the two days he departed for Galilee. (For Jesus himself had testified that a prophet has no honour in his own hometown.) So when he came to Galilee, the Galileans welcomed him, having seen all that he had done in Jerusalem at the feast. For they too had gone to the feast.

Jesus spoke with one lady in that area (which we read about last month) and she then talked to other people about her belief in Jesus. When did you last talk to someone who doesn't follow Jesus about your belief in Him?

Often when we tell others about Jesus it is just one of the steps in that person's spiritual journey to discover more about God. That is why it is also good to encourage them to read the Bible, so they can find out more for themselves. Like we have just read in this section, it enables them to hear directly what God is saying to them.

Conserving Coniston & Crake Project Update

2018 - A year in Review

So briefly the project has installed/agreed on nearly 9 km of fencing, created almost 9 sq.km of riparian habitats with buffer strips, de-culverted just under 500 m of buried watercourses, opened up 2 km of spawning areas with the installation of a fish easement, involved over 200 students and staff in freshwater activities, made and put up 30 nest boxes, engaged over 650 adults and children at 20+ events, shows, stands, walks and talks. Volunteers have given the equivalent of 173 days of work, cleaned approximately 40 sq. metres of gravel and helped restore and protect 100 sq. metres of reedbed.
