Dear Friends and Family,

May 2026

I've just returned from a three-week ministry journey through the state of Bahia, Brazil, and I'm still amazed by all that was accomplished in such a short window of time. Over the course of the trip, we drove over **1000 miles**, traveled through six cities, held **31 meetings**, and distributed more than **8,000 of Joyce Meyer's books** into communities and schools hungry for hope and encouragement.

This trip carried many layers, requiring us to navigate both cultural sensitivities and deep historical realities. While much of Brazil remains open and welcoming to the message of Jesus, some communities have a very different story and context. One of the clearest examples of this was the city of Mirangaba.

Mirangaba is known as a Quilombola community, historically a place of refuge where runaway slaves escaped oppression and found safety. Traditionally, its residents are descendants of African slaves, though over time many persecuted Indigenous peoples throughout Brazil also sought shelter there. The community carries a deeply unique cultural identity shaped through generations of isolation, spiritual traditions, and ancestral practices.

The opportunity to share the message of freedom found in Jesus was both humbling and deeply exciting. In the schools, the lack of understanding of the Gospel was immediately evident. That became especially clear as we presented the truth of John 10:10.

As this message was shared, students responded visibly during each gathering. You could sense walls beginning to crack as many heard, perhaps for the very first time, that life was not meant to be ruled by fear, suicide, depression and hopelessness, but by the freedom and abundant life found in Christ. We had the privilege of leading hundreds to Jesus for the very first time!

John 10:10:

“The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it abundantly.”



Our ministry in city schools is always partnered with local churches and community based evangelistic outreaches. This creates a bridge for the message of life to continue long after our meetings have ended. These strategic relationships allow every resource, conversation, and connection to extend beyond a single event, helping communities build ongoing support and discipleship long after we leave.



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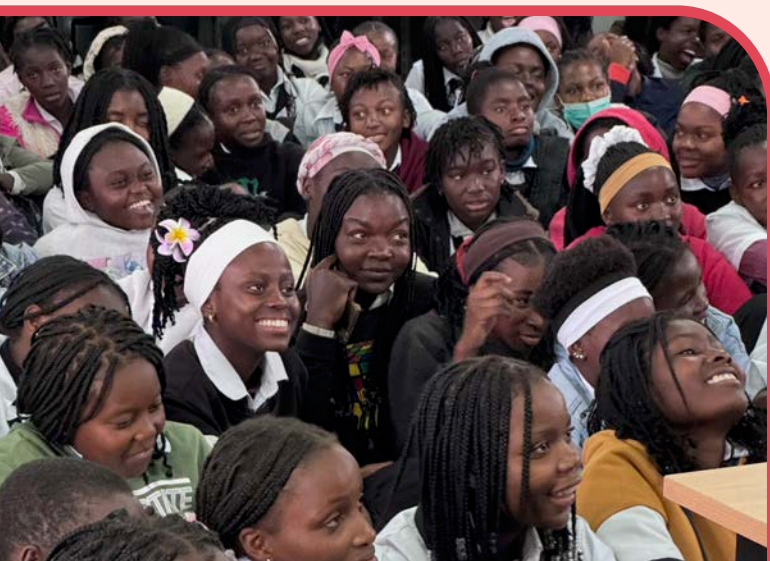


While the Viva Vida team was ministering in Brazil, Gabi and her team traveled to Mozambique, Africa, to lead a TPM outreach initiative focused on dignity, identity, and hope for young women.

In many parts of Mozambique, cultural pressures surrounding womanhood are intense. Virginity after the age of 16 is often viewed as failure, menstruation is treated as impurity, and singleness can carry the stigma of a curse. For many girls and women, these realities create deep emotional and social challenges.

In response, TPM partnered with @garnuu and @restaurandovidasmoz to bring practical support and life-giving conversations through education and the distribution of sanitary pad kits. Over the course of just **6 days**, the team held **14 meetings** and spoke face-to-face with nearly **1,900 girls and women**. Approximately **1,700 hygiene kits** were distributed in schools and churches throughout the region.

For the first time, the outreach also included a special gathering designed specifically for mothers, helping equip them to navigate conversations about sexuality, identity, and emotional health with both their own children and the young people in their churches.



Nearly 150 women attended.

This became a powerful and intentional new dimension of the mission, empowering older women to become voices of wisdom, truth, and protection for the next generation. It opened the door for honest and deeply needed conversations within families and faith communities alike.

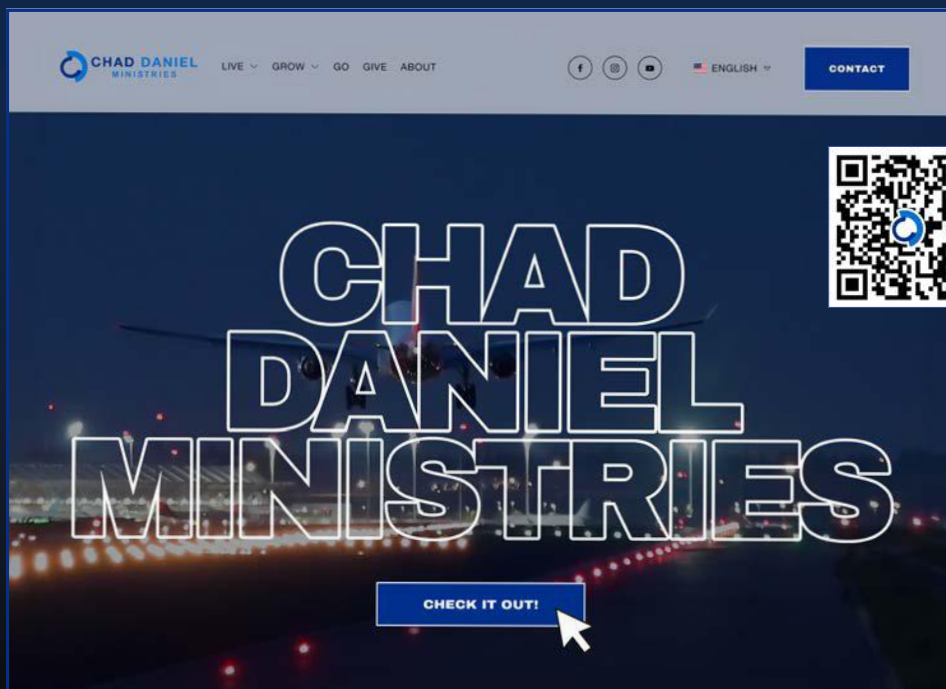
