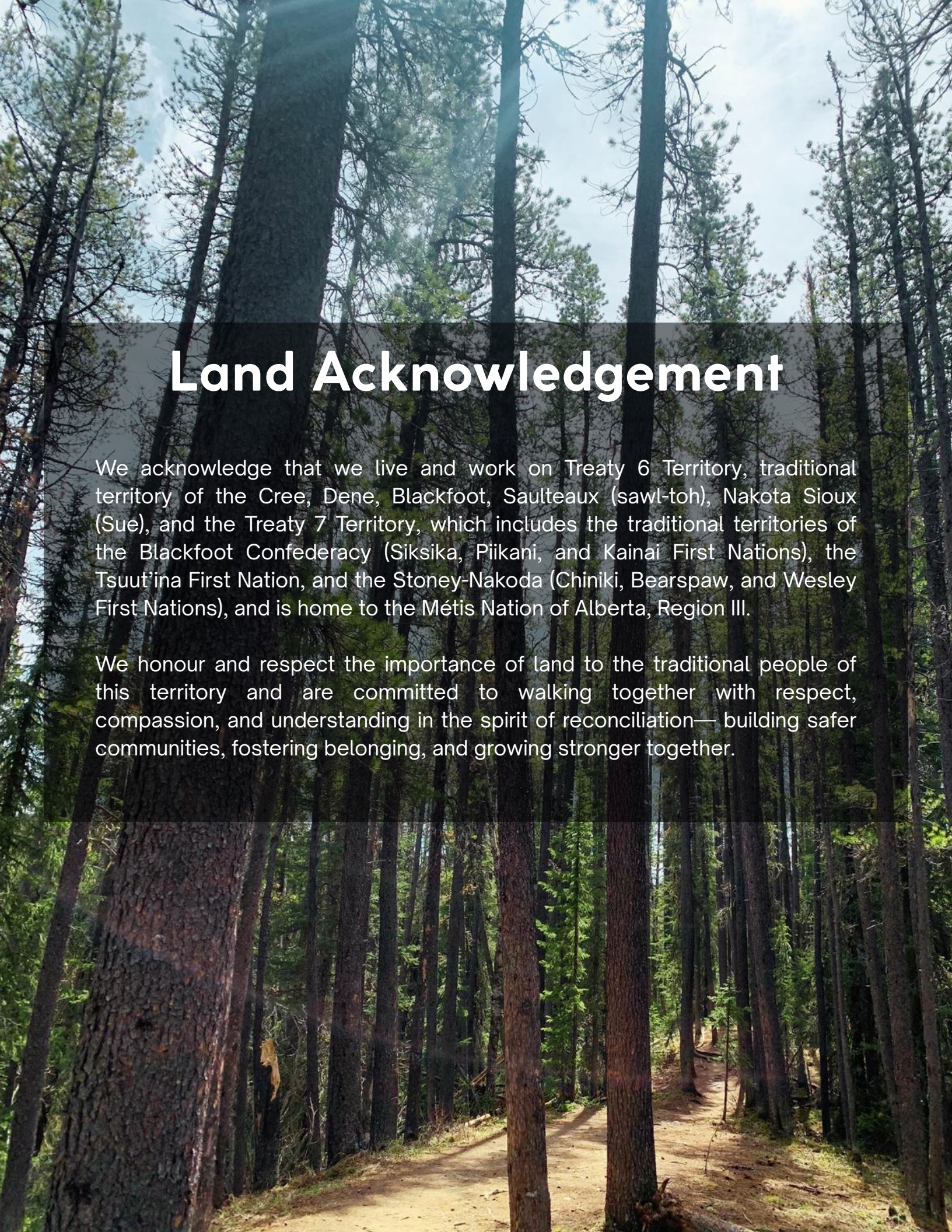

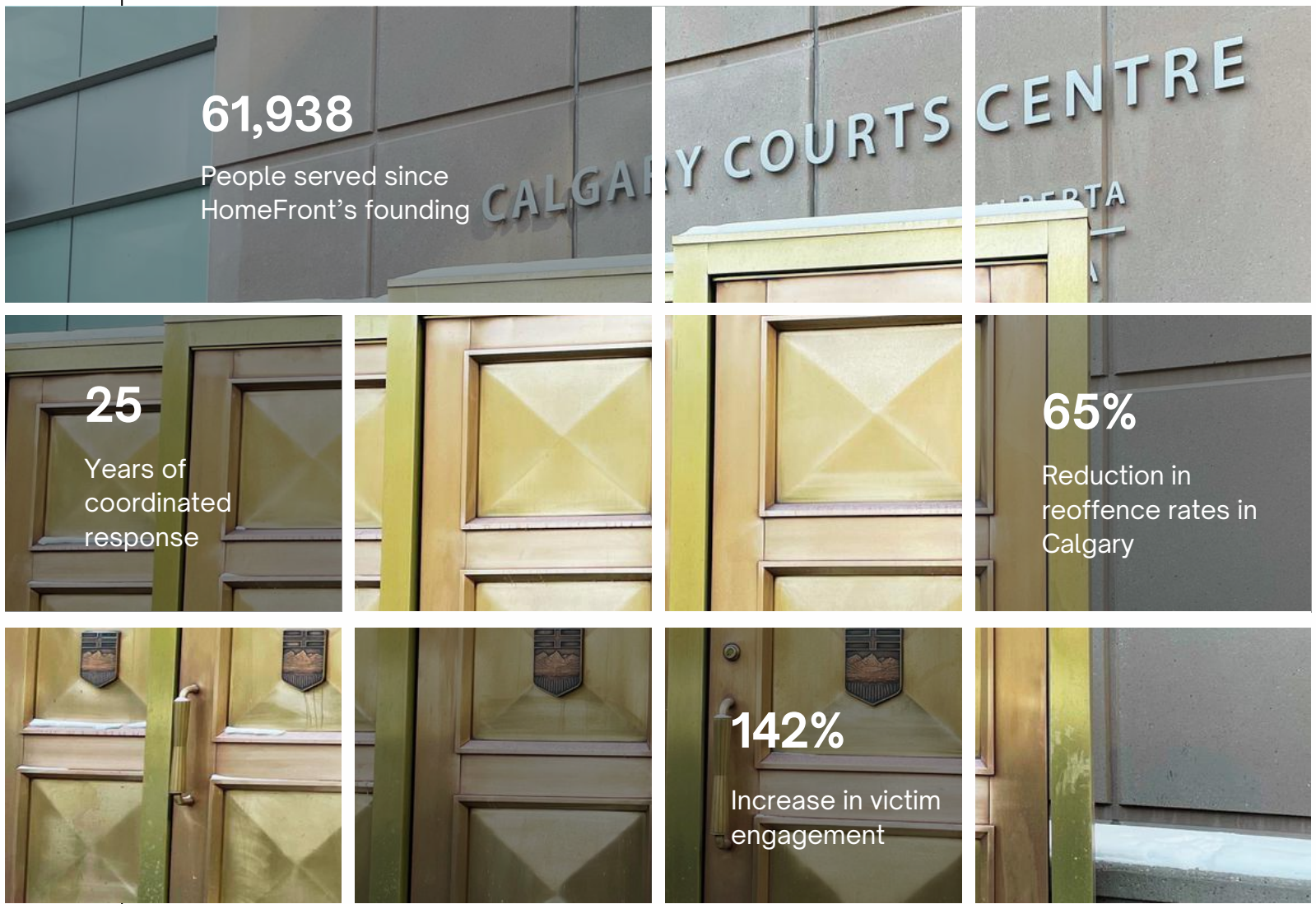

The Impact of Collaboration

Alongside justice partners, community organizations, and supporters, HomeFront has worked to ensure that a call for help is never the end of the story, but the beginning of a pathway forward. Over the years, we have learned, adapted, and continued to build programs shaped by evidence, collaboration, and the needs of the community.

Since 2000, HomeFront's programs have supported more than 61,938 people. Since HomeFront's inception into Specialized Domestic Violence Court, Calgary has seen a 65% reduction overall in domestic violence reoffence rates and a 83% reduction among first-time offenders. Perhaps most significantly, victim engagement in the court process increased by 142%, reflecting greater trust, support, and participation in achieving safer outcomes.

These outcomes are possible because of the sustained commitment of many partners: the justice professionals embedded in HomeFront's programs every day, and the donors and funders whose support has enabled HomeFront to expand its reach and deepen its impact over the past 25 years.

Impact Across Alberta Systems

HomeFront's coordinated response has improved safety, strengthened accountability, and connected families to critical supports. By reducing reoffending cases, increasing victim engagement, and improving collaboration across systems, HomeFront helps create safer communities while reducing pressure on public services. The estimated annual cost avoidance across justice, health and social services is \$27 million.

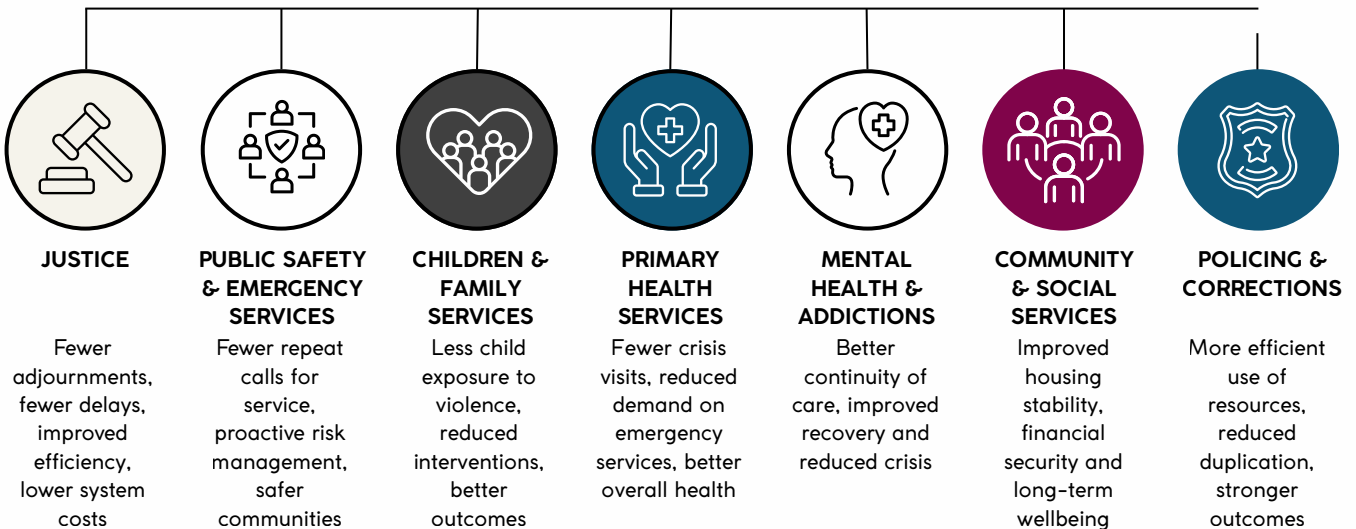

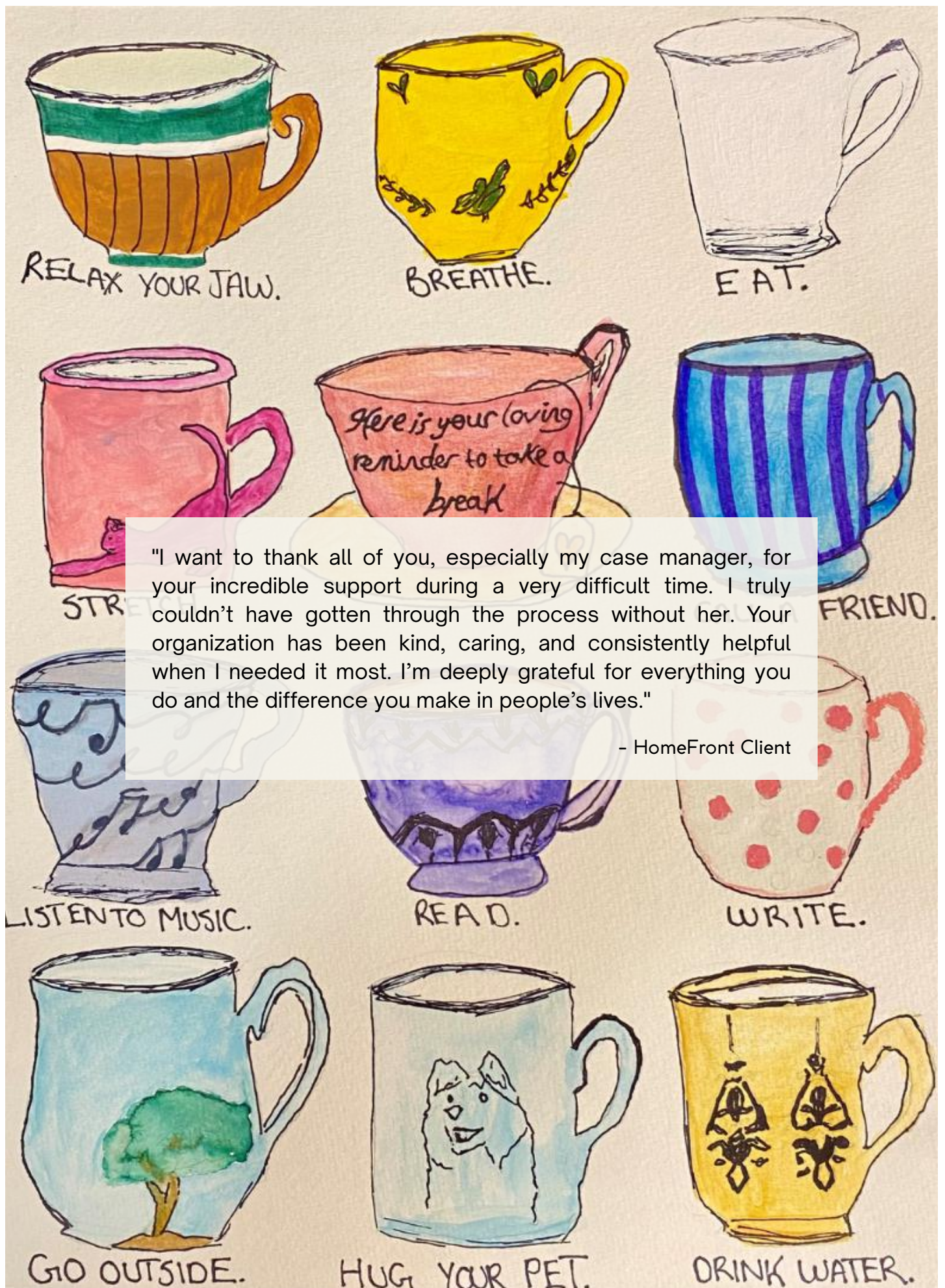

Expansion into Central Alberta

2025 marked one year of HomeFront serving Central Alberta. What began as an expansion into Red Deer's Domestic Violence Court, has grown into a developing network of partnerships, referrals, and community-based support reaching communities throughout Central Alberta.

HomeFront established partnerships with Crown Prosecution, the RCMP, Lacombe Police Service, Alberta Probation and Community Corrections, Child and Family Services, and the Central Alberta Regional Victim Serving Society. Referrals now are made through justice and community partners, as well as increasingly through self-referral—reflecting growing awareness of HomeFront's presence in the region. HomeFront now serves approximately 31% of Alberta's population, extending evidence-based intervention to more individuals and families across the province.

As HomeFront enters its second year in Central Alberta, the focus will be on strengthening capacity, deepening partnerships, and ensuring every victim can access consistent support no matter where they live in the province. Additional funding is being sought to secure dedicated office space—providing a safe, accessible location for clients to meet with case managers. Continued investment from funders and donors will be essential to meeting the growing demand.

Safety of Indigenous Women in an Urban Setting (SIWUS)

Safety of Indigenous Women in Urban Settings (SIWUS), led by HomeFront's Community Mobilization Officer Laura Ducharme, continues to bring together Indigenous and non-Indigenous agencies in Calgary to strengthen supports for Indigenous women and girls impacted by domestic violence.

SIWUS continues to foster opportunities for organizations to share knowledge, strengthen relationships, and develop approaches that honour traditional ways of knowing and teaching. This work has contributed to growing momentum across the community, with new partnerships, conversations, and initiatives continuing to emerge.

SIWUS remains a complex and evolving initiative that requires sustained collaboration, consultation, trust-building, and time to create the meaningful and lasting change our communities need.

HomeFront is grateful to the United Way of Calgary and Area for their continued support, which has made it possible for this important work to continue moving forward.



Bringing Domestic Violence Collaboration to Spain

Last September, HomeFront's Joy Steppacher, was joined by fellow National Domestic Violence Justice Network co-founder, Patrick Ladouceur of Laurentian University, to present at the European Conference on Domestic Violence in Barcelona, Spain on "Improving Domestic Violence Court & Services Responses through Collaboration: The Example of the Canadian National Domestic Violence Justice Network."

Today, the Network continues to expand, with representation from Alberta, British Columbia, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Quebec, Ontario, Prince Edward Island, and Newfoundland—demonstrating Canada's commitment to an informed coordinated, and collaborative responses to domestic violence.

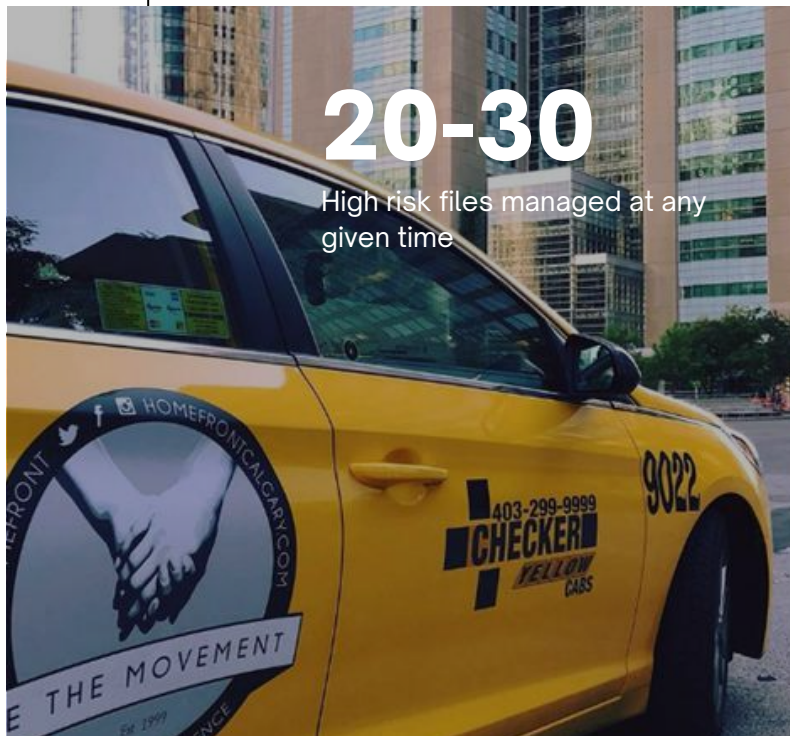


15 years of the High Risk Management Initiative (HRMI)

Some domestic violence cases carry an especially high risk of serious harm or homicide, requiring immediate action, close collaboration, and ongoing intervention. For the past 15 years, HomeFront's High Risk Management Initiative (HRMI) has brought agencies together to respond to those cases with urgency, coordination, and a shared commitment to victim safety.

HRMI is HomeFront's most intensive and collaborative program, focused on the top 1% domestic violence cases identified in Calgary as having the highest risk of lethal violence. Through the program, more than 14 justice, health, and community agencies come together to share information, assess risk, and coordinate immediate interventions to support victim safety and offender accountability.

In 2025, HRMI marked 15 years since its first case, and 15 years without a single homicide of a victim receiving support through the program. That milestone reflects the dedication of the many partners, case managers, and clients who have contributed to its success, and the collective support of funders and donors who believe in the importance of prevention and coordinated intervention.

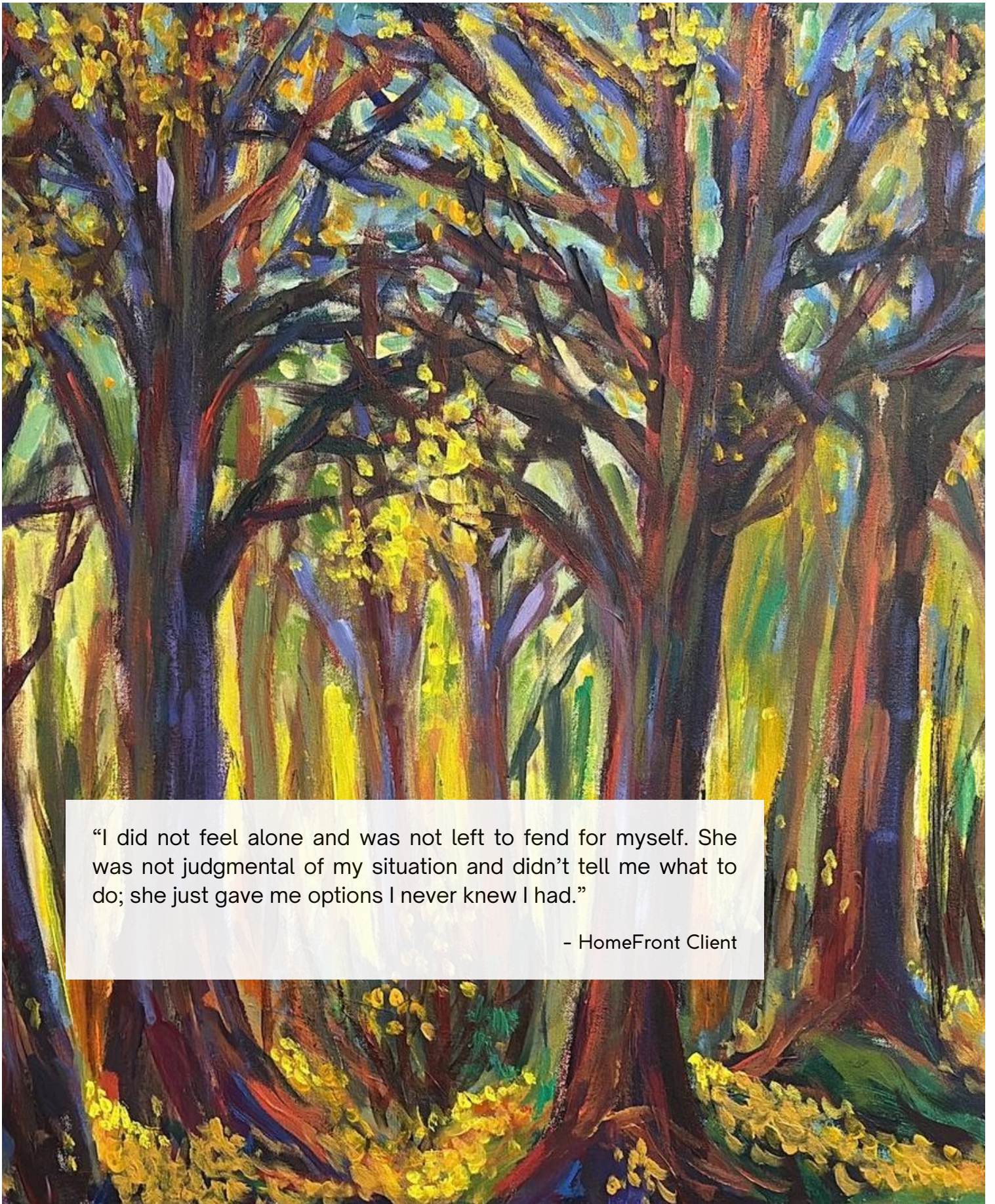
