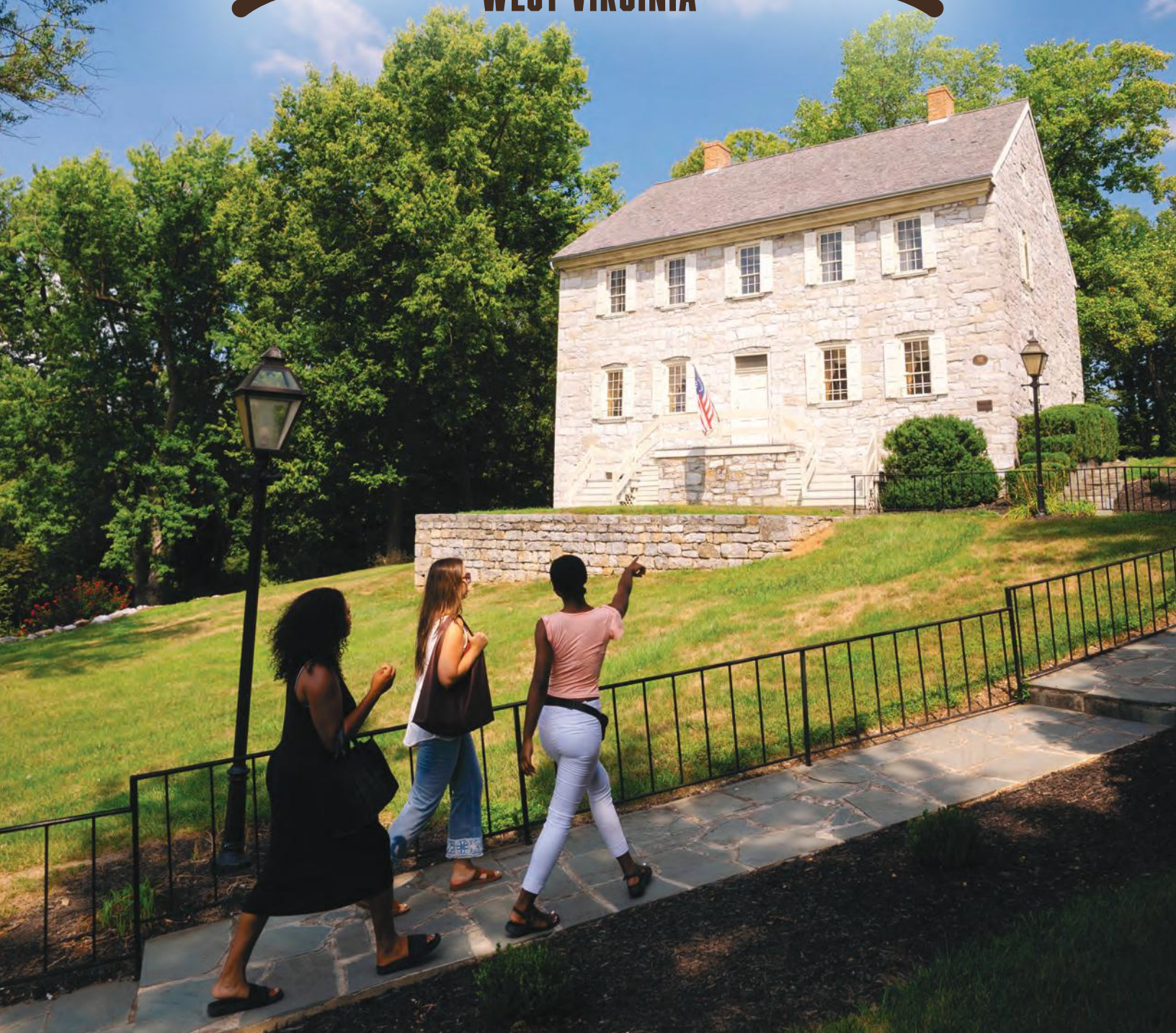

Follow Our Tracks Through Time

Just a little over an hour west of Washington, D.C., where rivers meet mountains and history happens, Martinsburg, West Virginia, is the perfect destination for lovers of history. From railroads to rivers and George Washington to geocaching, Martinsburg is at the heart of inspiring stories and historic significance.

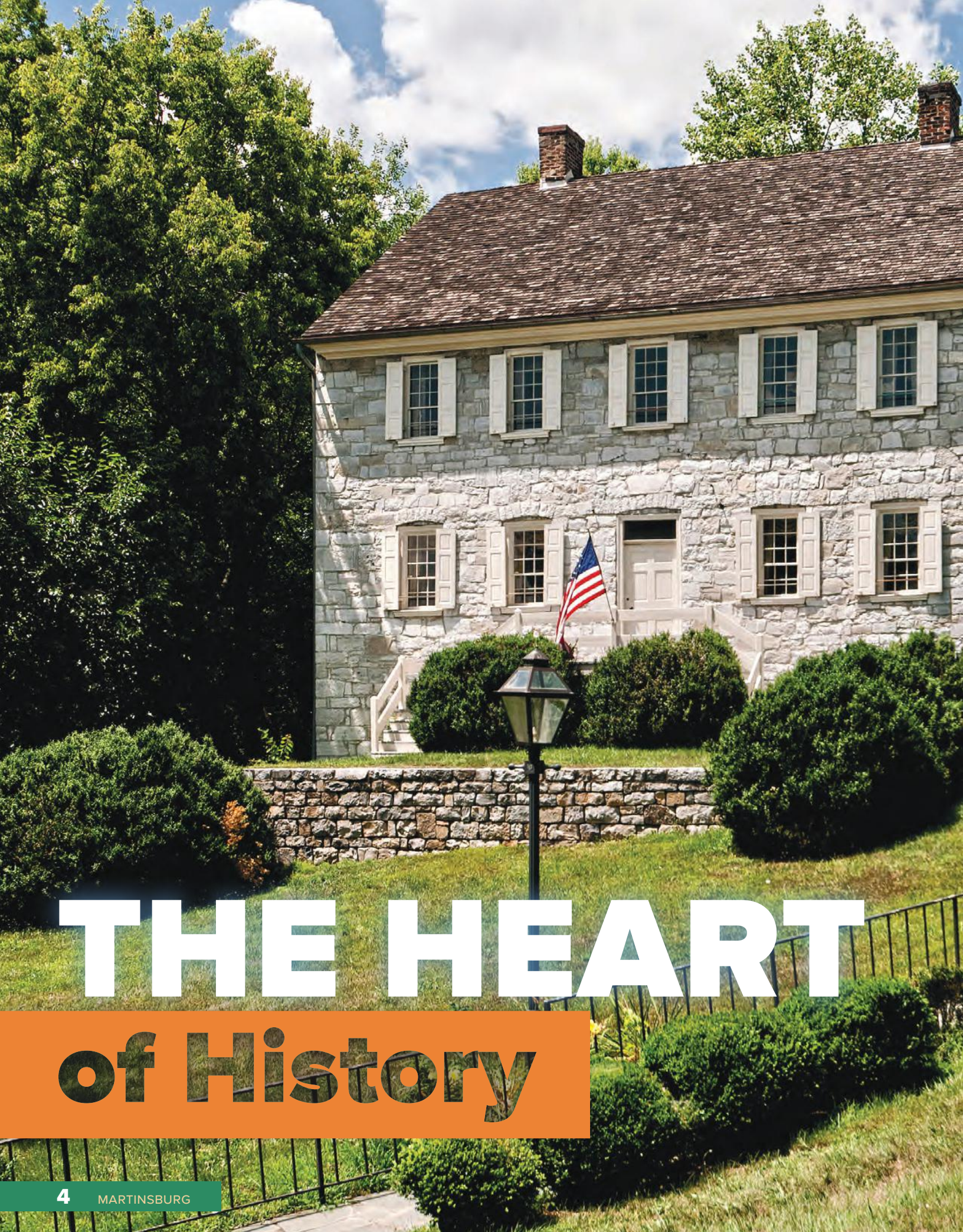
When the B&O railroad arrived in Martinsburg in the 1840s, it not only made the little town a hub of commerce—its roundhouse became a hub in many chapters of America's story. The Martinsburg Roundhouse is now the sole surviving cast iron-framed roundhouse in the world and a Civil Engineering Landmark and hosts tours and events in its unique historical setting.

History is vividly alive all across town. Revolutionary War General Adam Stephen built his house here of native limestone in the 1770s and 1780s, a fine example of colonial stone architecture. The restored home is furnished with period pieces and is open for guided tours as a historic house museum—including its own cave. You can also visit the childhood home of Confederate spy Belle Boyd. This stalwart young woman crossed military lines several times to pass information to General Stonewall Jackson during the Civil War.

Whether you're visiting for a long weekend or an extensive stay, you'll find adventures of all kinds during your trip to Berkeley County. The area is known for lush forests, bountiful biking and hiking trails, enthusiastic bird-watching, and world-class geocaching.

Berkeley County has rich agricultural lands, and picturesque farms highlight the landscape. Whether you're on the quest for fresh harvest or simply a refreshing afternoon outdoors, authentic farm markets welcome guests all year 'round.

Back in town, stroll North Queen Street to discover eclectic shops, galleries, and specialty stores. Whether you're grabbing a quick bite to eat while shopping or planning an elegant date night, Martinsburg has restaurants to satisfy any craving—and local breweries and distilleries keep the flavors flowing into the evening hours with libations you can't find anywhere but here in Berkeley County.



THE HEART of History



Berkeley County became official in 1772 when it was formed from Frederick County, Virginia—our neighbor to the south. As a hub that connects east to west and north to south, we’ve had a front row seat for geological, social, and industrial change: from fossils to frontier life, the founding of a nation to brother fighting brother, the iron horse to the automobile. This county has been home to inventors, insurrectionists, and inspiring leaders.

Morgan Morgan—one of the first white arrivals in West Virginia—arrived from Delaware in 1728. He was the state’s first licensed tavern keeper in the territory that became West Virginia and builder of its first public road. He built his cabin in the 1730s on 1,000 acres acquired through a King’s patent. The simple reconstructed cabin consisted of one room with a loft above. Nearby is stone house built by Zackquill Morgan, son of Morgan Morgan, who later left the area and founded Morgantown, West Virginia. Directly across the street from **Morgan Cabin** sits the **Zackquill Morgan House**. Morgan Cabin is one stop on the **Washington Heritage Trail** driving tour, which identifies unique historic sites along 127 miles of the Eastern Panhandle. Other Berkeley County must-visit locations on the trail include **Green Hill Cemetery**, which offers a panoramic view of farmlands.

History courses deep through the county seat of Martinsburg. General Adam Stephen, the town’s founder, fought alongside George Washington as his second in command during the French and Indian War. He also served during the Revolutionary War. **The Adam Stephen House** at 309 East John Street is a national landmark. Made from locally quarried limestone, the building even has a basement entrance to a natural underground cave and tunnel system that snakes below town. The neighboring **Triple Brick Museum**, built in the 1870s to house railroad workers, also showcases historical memorabilia.

The Baltimore & Ohio Railroad first crisscrossed the town with tracks in 1841. Martinsburg’s prominence as a transportation center led to its importance to both sides during the Civil War—its tracks became a prime route for hauling troops and supplies, which made it a target for attacks. By the Civil War’s conclusion, the besieged town had changed hands 50 times, and the railroad was left in ruins. In 1866, the B&O Railroad rebuilt the **Martinsburg Roundhouse**, which had a turntable to service locomotives. The only remaining roundhouse worldwide with a cast iron frame and the site of the first labor strike in America in 1877, this architectural marvel is a National Historic Landmark.

Espionage also marks a chapter in Martinsburg's storied past, courtesy of Civil War spy Belle Boyd. This spirited young lady relayed messages about Union activities to General Stonewall Jackson. Her reconnaissance career led to imprisonments, but she ultimately secured release and went on to write and act. **The Belle Boyd House**, where she grew up, now houses a museum about Berkeley County's history. It also serves as the county's **Official Visitors Center**. Next door is the **Berkeley County Historical Society Archives Center**, which contains a treasure trove of family records, photographs, maps, and microfiche.

Extensive orchards blossomed in the countryside outside town. Berkeley County became an agricultural center and a leading apple producer, and the city of Martinsburg thrived. You can learn about Berkeley County's deep farming heritage and enjoy a wonderful collection of agricultural tools, memorabilia, and equipment at the **Dillon Farm Museum**.

If you're looking to mix history with fun, **For The Kids, By George Children's Museum** is a perfect blend. Part of the Washington Heritage Trail, the museum is a high-touch, hands-on space with a focus on young George Washington and the rich railroad history of West Virginia. The attraction is housed inside the **Historic Caperton Train Station**.

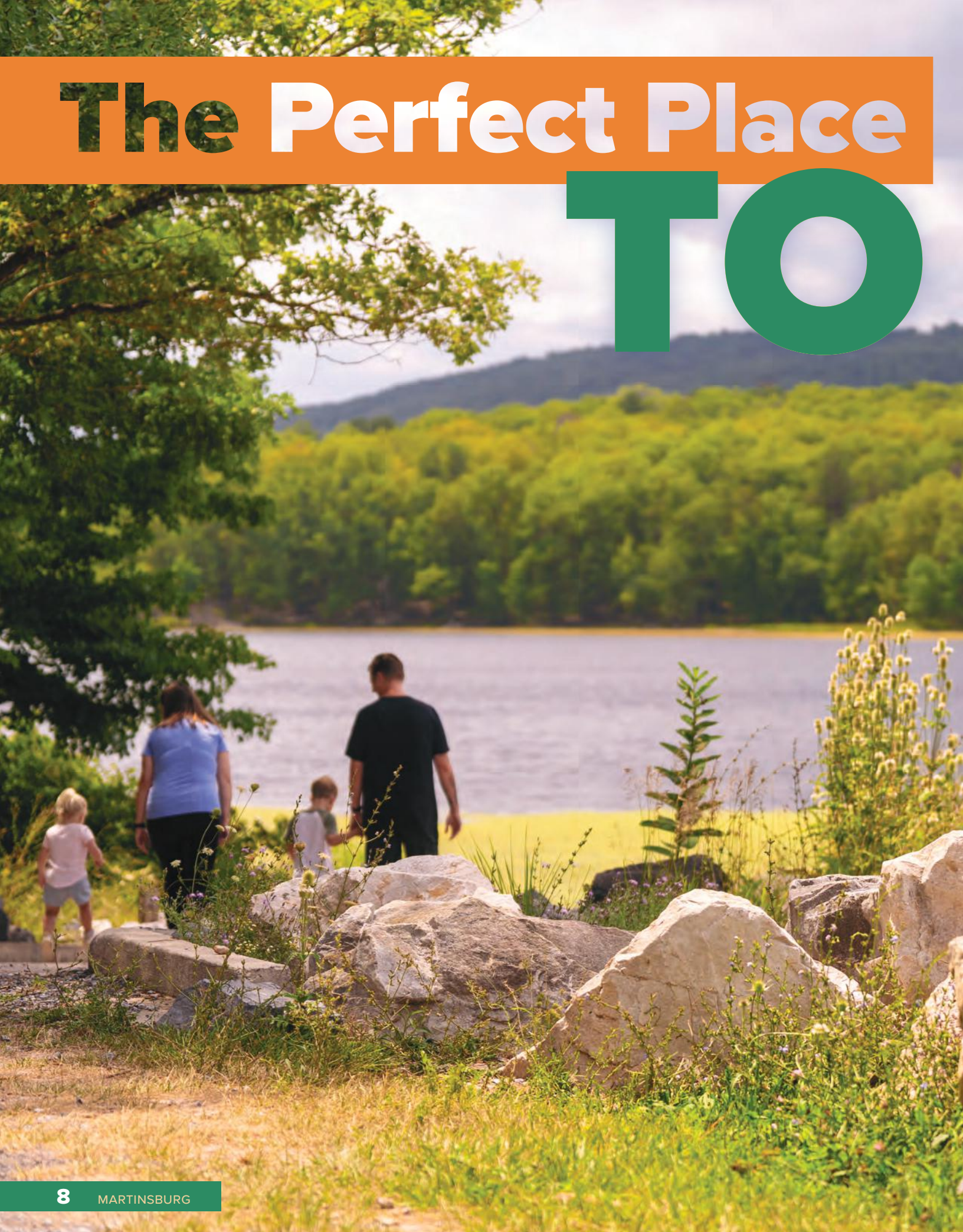


A notorious Confederate spy during the American Civil War, **Belle Boyd** was known for her cunning, bravery, and charm. She gathered vital intelligence for the Rebel cause and was arrested six times for espionage—never incarcerated. Purportedly, Boyd once snuck across enemy lines and returned to safety, only to discover bullet holes in her dress. Boyd is a celebrated figure in American espionage history.

Welcome to SLEEPY CREEK LAKE

SLEEPY CREEK WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA

This 205-acre impoundment was created in 1962 by the West Virginia Department of Natural Resources to increase public-accessible fishing opportunities in the eastern panhandle. The Fisheries Management Unit has undertaken fishery habitat enhancement projects including Channel Catfish stocking, lime application to increase lake productivity, and near-shore vegetation control measures to improve recreational fishery quality. Thanks to these water quality and habitat improvement projects, Sleepy Creek Lake routinely produces trophy Largemouth Bass, a sustainably reproducing population of Northern Pike, Crappie, Bluegill, and Catfish angling opportunities are also among the best in the region. Funds from the sale of hunting and fishing licenses and sporting equipment have been used to complete fisheries improvement projects.

Around here, being in nature is in our nature. Berkeley County is filled with beautiful fields, forests, lakes, and mountains—the perfect place to play outside.

The county is blessed with many great hiking opportunities. Whether you're looking for a peaceful walk in the woods or a challenging climb to a mountain overlook, there is a trail for you. On the west side of the county, you can hike a section of the **Tuscarora Trail**, a 250-mile offshoot of the Appalachian Trail. At the county's eastern edge, a section of the 104-acre **Yankauer Nature Preserve**, historic farmland that is now forested, overlooks the Potomac River. The preserve's 2.4 miles of trails are one of the best places in the area for a spring native wildflower walk.

From back road pavement to backwoods trails, we have so many places to explore by bicycle. For those who prefer pavement without traffic, the **Route 9 Bike Path** offers 10-plus miles of rolling hills to explore. If you prefer to get dirty, the mountain bike trail at **Poor House Farm** and the many rugged trails in **Sleepy Creek Wildlife Management Area** are waiting to challenge you.

Motocross enthusiasts flock to **Tomahawk MX Park** near Hedgesville. This 110-acre site has four tracks of varied riding levels and terrain. On the site are the main motocross track, a supercross track, and two different tracks for beginners and advanced beginners.

If you're looking for a spot to put your kayak, canoe, or boat in the water, you have many options here. The **Potomac River**, **Back Creek**, and **Opequon** streams, along with the 205-acre **Sleepy Creek Lake**, offer a variety of water adventures. And if you'd rather just watch, birding is enjoyed at **Stauffer's Marsh Nature Preserve** or **Yankauer Nature Preserve**, both managed by the Potomac Audubon Society. There is also great seasonal bird watching at Sleepy Creek WMA.

For an extended adventure getaway, **The Woods** is a popular destination and golf community located between Martinsburg and Berkeley Springs. This quiet retreat boasts two golf courses, the Sleepy Creek Spa, a sports center, two outdoor pools, indoor and outdoor tennis, racquetball, dining, and direct access to over 70 miles of hiking trails in the adjoining Sleepy Creek WMA.

Hunting and fishing opportunities abound in Berkeley County. The 23,000-acre **Sleepy Creek WMA** is popular with hunters looking for deer, turkey, squirrel, black bear, and more. From **Sleepy Creek Lake** to the Potomac River and other sites, you can find your new favorite spot to cast a line.

Berkeley County is blessed with an incredible array of local parks and recreation venues. **Poor House Farm Park** is a popular, spacious park that provides a number of recreational and leisure opportunities. A new playground structure, sand volleyball courts, a disc golf course, catch and release fishing (license required), walking trails, and plenty of open green space await you at this beautiful county park.

In Martinsburg, **War Memorial Park** is the gemstone of the city's parks and by far the most visited in Berkeley County. It offers a variety of facilities and recreational outlets for the whole family, including a swimming pool, tennis and pickleball courts, sand volleyball, a playground, and miniature golf. And **Ambrose Park** is a great park for the entire family, including your dog! The park includes a children's garden, a dog park, playgrounds, and areas to picnic.

What will you **DISCOVER?**

Join the treasure hunt! Geocaching combines technology and the outdoors to send people looking for clues and cached treasures using GPS tracking.

Berkeley County is home to more than 213 active caches and multiple geo trails for explorers of all experience levels. Caches are hidden or are in plain sight and can look like anything—from a birdhouse to a fake rock. Once a cache is found and opened, geocachers sign the log book inside the cache and return it to its hiding place before moving on to the next challenge.

By partnering with local cache creator WVTim, we've created memorable geotrails that reward geocachers with a commemorative, trackable coin. We have more than 57 active caches that have earned 100 favorite points or greater!

Our newest trail is our **Hidden Treasures GeoTrail**. This trail allows you to travel throughout the county and visit our hidden treasures while learning more about the place we call home. Enjoy back roads that follow the same paths that Native Americans traveled for hunting; see areas where locals fought the Tories during the Revolutionary War, or where brother fought brother during the American Civil War. Experience what makes Berkeley County rich in history and culture.

Berkeley County is a favorite site for geocachers nationwide, so charge your phone, round up your friends, and go hunting for your next adventure.

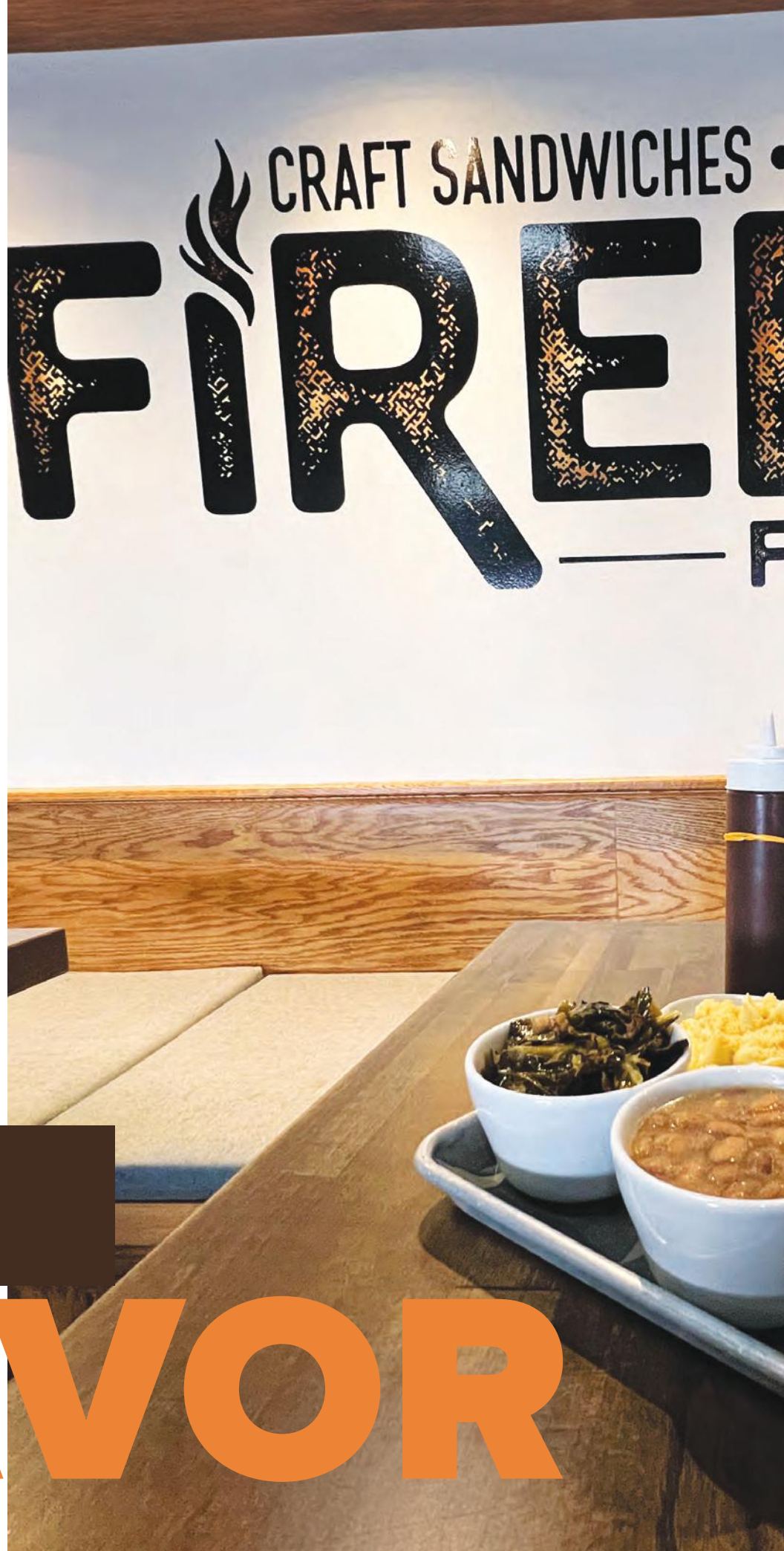

This cozy wine bar dishes up small plates with locally sourced ingredients, and features an extensive array of spirits, brews, and wine. **Stoney's Whiskey Wine & Raw Bar** features the largest selection of whiskey, bourbon, and scotch in the Eastern Panhandle. **Thai Martinsburg** is a local favorite offering cuisine that contains a spectrum of flavors and textures so vast that no two dishes are ever the same. Eat inside or enjoy the outdoor patio in the summer months.

What once began as a family horse farm is now serving up good times with moonshine. Opened in December 2013, **Black Draft Distillery** is the first distillery in Berkeley County since prohibition. Black Draft produces whiskey and bourbon using unique and all-natural ingredients sourced less than 10 miles away. Try seasonal flavors at this locally owned distillery!

If you prefer beer, head to **Amani Brewing**, the county's only brewery. Amani has a beautiful taproom and a fenced-in area to enjoy a great craft beer in the outdoors.

The **Orr's Farm Market** is a must-visit destination any season, but especially in fall, when it features an expansive pumpkin patch and apple-picking opportunities. Don't miss their bakery-fresh pies, donuts, and dessert breads for the ride home. The market also hosts lively food truck events with local vendors and live music throughout the year, making it a wonderful slice of Martinsburg culture. With scenic orchard views and a selection of homemade jams and baked goods perfect for gift-giving, Orr's offers an idyllic setting for diving into local flavors.

Located in Inwood, **Taylor's Farm Market** is open year-round with products from many local farms as well as West Virginia wines, fresh-baked goods, farm-fresh dairy, and local meats.

Kitchens Farm Market in Falling Waters offers in-season fruits and vegetables grown on the farm and harvested from its own orchards. It also sells naturally grown beef and seasonal flowers, plants, pumpkins, mums and other decorative items. Kitchens was named West Virginia Conservation Farm of the Year in 2008.

Visit **Spring Valley Farm Market** for fruits and vegetables picked daily from its farm in nearby Hampshire County, West Virginia.

The **Martinsburg Farmers Market** is open every Saturday May through October and is located at the Martinsburg Roundhouse. Discover the freshest meats, locally raised produce, baked goods, and unique handcrafted items.

In the fall, locals and visitors alike love to visit **Old McDonald's Farm Pumpkin Patch & Maze** in Inwood for some good old-fashioned family fun. **Sibert's Farm Fresh Produce** in Martinsburg offers fresh produce during the summer and a corn maze and pumpkin patch in the fall.

Stop and smell the roses at **Jordan & Hess Co.** Specializing in home decor and floral arrangements, this boutique department store has a relaxed vibe and offers a range of shopping delights for the home and a unique selection of ladies' fine clothing. Other florists in town include **Bells & Bows**, **Depot Florist**, and **Ginger's Flowers**, all conveniently located in downtown Martinsburg.

Everything's better with chocolate, and that includes a day in Martinsburg. In 1998, the family-run **DeFluri's Fine Chocolates** relocated its factory and showroom to a 1930s-era building on North Queen Street. The chocolatiers have been satisfying the town's sweet tooth ever since.

A women's clothing and accessory boutique, **Westwood Charm** offers a wide range of styles and sizes. If you need a little something for a friend, partner, or yourself, this is the place to find it. **Savannah Grace Boutique** aspires to help women feel beautiful through affordable, comfortable, trendy fashion.

At **Bank Books**, located in a historic downtown bank, you can browse bookshelves right in the old vault! The store's knowledgeable staff will help you find your next literary adventure. **Mamba Collectibles** specializes in rare and sought-after items, offering a vast selection of sports cards, trading cards, comic books, and memorabilia. **Queen Street Marketplace** is a discount store in Martinsburg Historic District. It buys merchandise by the truckload and passes the savings on to its customers.

King Street Coffee & Tobacco Emporium has served Martinsburg for over three decades. Whether you're young or just young at heart, the **Wonderment Puppet Theater** in Martinsburg provides a slice of magic and a lot of laughter with its one-of-a-kind puppet shows. In 2007, puppeteer Joe Santoro and his wife, Jane, purchased an 1880s Victorian house to start Wonderment, the region's only year-round interactive puppet theater. It serves as both entertainment venue and museum. The space offers an array of hands-on items to play with, including puzzles, musical noise makers, and a play theater where guests can put on their own puppet shows. The center is also home to multiple mazes, a wishing well, and an art gallery.

A cultural landmark constructed in 1913, the **Apollo Civic Theatre** has been home to vaudeville productions, concerts, and movies, and it continues to host stage productions and community events. **Berkeley Art Works** is a community-based arts facility that supports local and regional artists and brings quality arts experiences to the public.

Discover interesting and eclectic treasures as you explore the **Queen Street Gallery** in downtown Martinsburg. Also located downtown, the **Apple Blossom Art Gallery** showcases and sells work crafted by local artists. The gallery is adjacent to the **Apple B&B**, a beautifully restored 1849 Greek Revival home.
