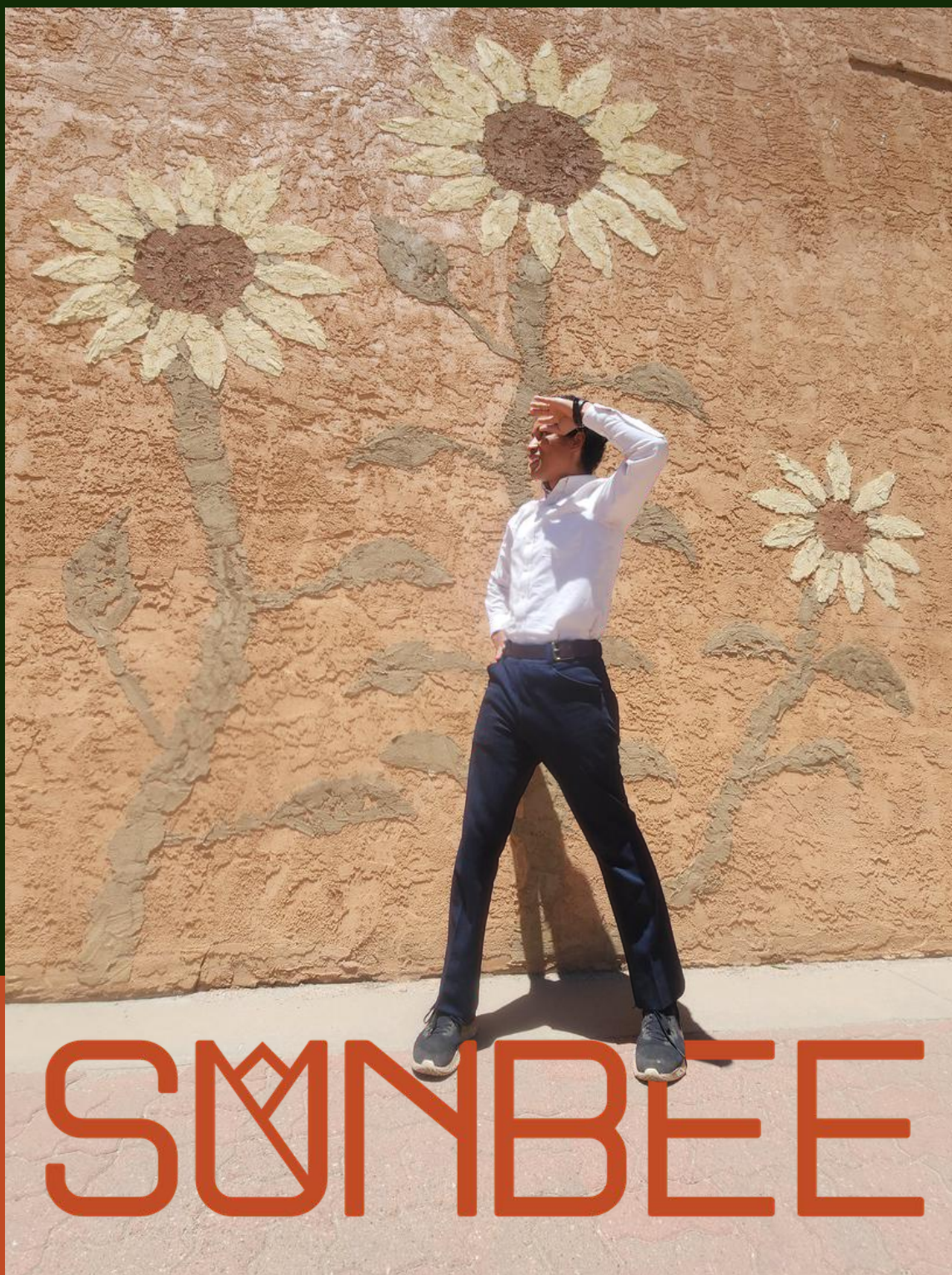

Our goal is to get be a place to get more involved in Horticulture, human culture, and everywhere they meet.

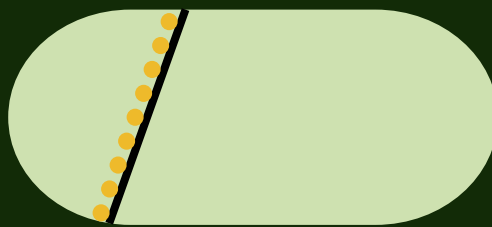

Can I really make a difference? Yes! There's actually something incredibly rewarding & empowering that you can do in your own space that makes a difference that you can see for yourself in a short time. If you have a balcony or the use of a planter or a yard, consider planting a host plant. A host plant is one that feeds a caterpillar of a particular butterfly. Many are familiar with the milkweed and the monarch caterpillar. Their chrysalis is a beautiful shade of green and a rim around it is dotted with gold-no kidding. When we start planting native plants, the nature that depended on them returns.



At Ironweed Nursery, we grow KY native plants that can be used in spaces from formal to informal, including grasses, ferns, vines, flowering, shrubs & trees. Folks can reconnect with the plants Daniel Boone saw when he first travelled through. It's a happy thing.
