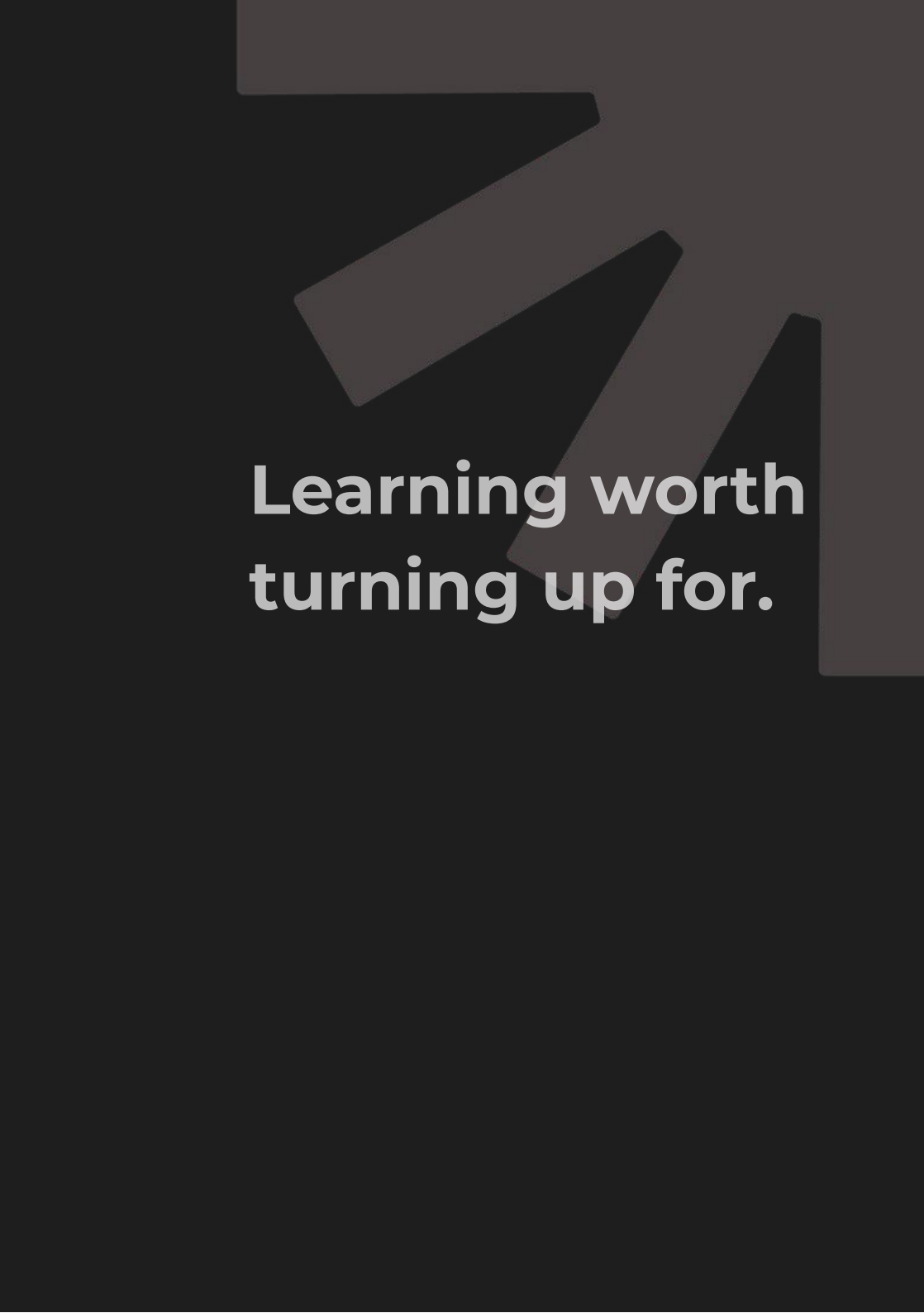

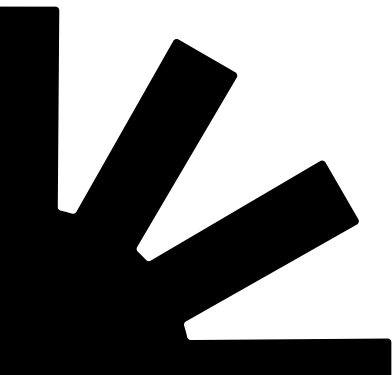


At Horizons, children and young people connect with learning that is relevant to their lives, interests and future.

Through five purposeful pathways for different ages, stages and needs, we combine high expectations with high challenge and expert support to help every child and young person make meaningful progress and achieve.

Horizons builds connections that create a sense of belonging. We help children and young people discover what they are good at, build confidence, become more independent, develop skills, achieve qualifications and prepare for their next steps and future opportunities.



Horizons was established in September 2026 by Maiden Erlegh Trust, a mixed-setting multi-academy trust founded in 2014, with schools in Berkshire and South Oxfordshire. Maiden Erlegh Trust is known for delivering high-quality, inclusive education that combines strong academic ambition with pastoral care.

Horizons was created in response to increasing demand for high-quality alternative educational pathways by opening a new primary site in Bracknell, offering new vocational courses delivered at Maiden Erlegh School, creating new tuition and therapy teams and combining these with the expertise of Cranbury College.

The result is Horizons Alternative Provision Academy: five purposeful pathways for different ages, stages and needs.

Introduction to our Pathways

The five Horizons Pathways are purposefully designed so every child and young person can make progress and achieve, whatever their age, stage, need or educational journey so far.

Across every pathway, National Curriculum and vocational learning sit alongside a rich personal development and enrichment programme, giving young people different ways to learn, achieve, see their progress and feel good about themselves.

Our expert staff combine high expectations and high challenge with the support each young person needs to make progress, with specialist therapies available as needed.



Primary Alternative Provision | Bracknell Short-stay Primary Pathway

A short-stay primary pathway that helps children without a permanent school placement make progress, build confidence and move to their next permanent placement within one term.



Launch follows the school year, so whenever children join they continue with the National Curriculum, activities and school milestones, including phonics, SATs, swimming, sports day and Christmas play. Highly tailored learning, purposeful enrichment, therapies and expert support help each child make meaningful progress.



Secondary | Reading

Short-stay Secondary Pathway



Short-stay secondary pathway that helps young people without a permanent school placement continue their learning and make progress to move to their next permanent placement within one term. Learning is tailored to individual needs and interests, with qualifications including Functional Skills, AQA Unit Awards and vocational qualifications enabling achievement and confidence building at every step.

Through community projects and our six enrichment pillars, young people develop social and practical skills, to better understand themselves and others, learn about rules and boundaries, become more independent and prepare for adulthood and future opportunities.



Flexible Learning Pathway

In School Support, Vocational Courses & Tuition | All ages



A multi-faceted flexible pathway built on the principle that there is more than one way to succeed. Succeed includes outreach to help young people succeed in their existing school as well as our own tutoring team for those unable to access the classroom, and year-long Hair and Beauty and Trades vocational courses. Young people develop practical skills, develop personally and prepare for adulthood. The Succeed team also supports Launch and Elevate, helping young people back into mainstream education.



Primary Special School | Reading

Permanent Primary Pathway

A permanent primary pathway where children learn in a small setting designed around their individual needs. Children follow the National Curriculum alongside a rich personal development and enrichment programme, which gives them opportunities to build skills, experience new things and prepare for secondary school and young adulthood. Our expert staff understand each child and provide the support they need to thrive.



Hospital Learning

Royal Berkshire Hospital

A hospital learning pathway that helps children and young people continue learning and making progress while receiving medical care at Royal Berkshire Hospital. The Haven team provides learning on the children's wards, including one-to-one teaching, and works with the child's school so they stay connected with their education. Haven gives parents and carers confidence that their child's learning is being taken care of at what can be a difficult time.

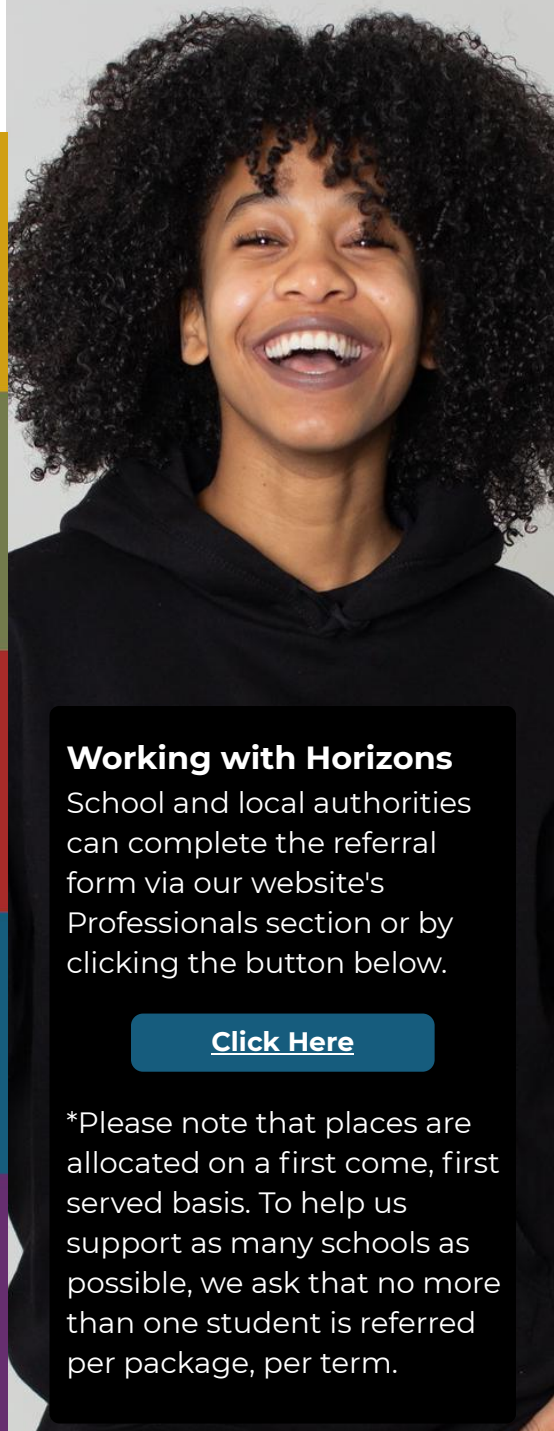

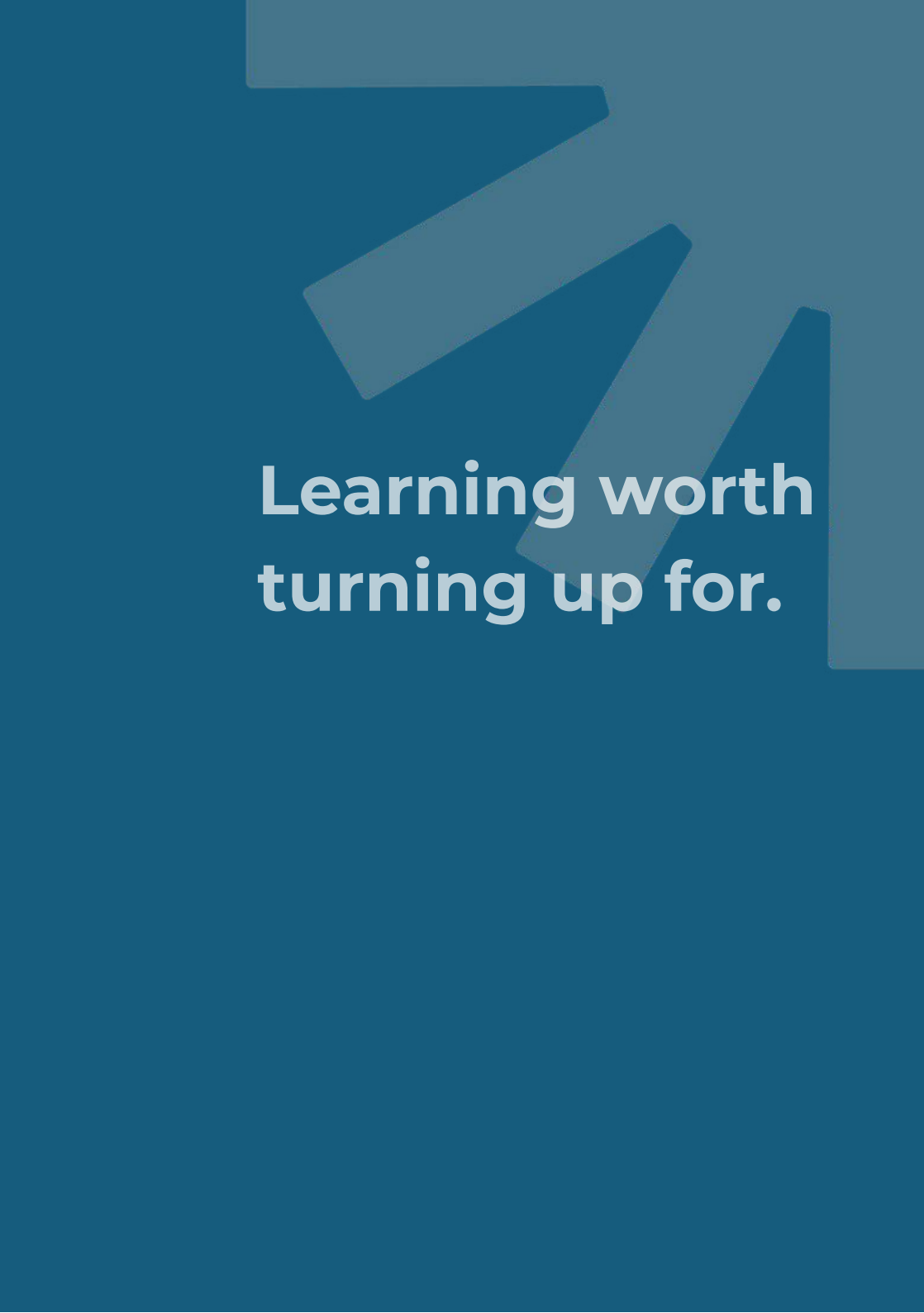

Primary Pathway

A short-stay primary pathway that helps children who may not have a permanent placement, or who are struggling to access it successfully, build confidence and move to their next permanent placement within one term. Launch follows the school year, so whenever children join they continue with the National Curriculum and take part in the learning, activities and milestones happening at that point, for example phonics, SATs, swimming, sports day and Christmas play. Tailored learning, purposeful enrichment, therapies and expert support help each child develop and make meaningful progress throughout their time at Horizons.

- Placements for up to six weeks initially, with the possibility of extension if appropriate
- Reviews every three weeks with all stakeholders
- Academic and pastoral pathways followed

Secondary Packages

Cranbury Road, Reading

Short-stay Secondary Pathway

A short-stay secondary pathway that helps young people continue their learning and address gaps, make progress and build confidence in what they can achieve. Learning is tailored to their specific needs and interests, and all students gain qualifications relevant to them including Functional Skills, AQA Unit Awards and vocational qualifications.

Personal development and enrichment are important at every step. Through community projects and our six enrichment pillars, young people develop social and practical skills, learn more about themselves and others, develop their understanding of rules and boundaries, become more independent and prepare for adulthood and future opportunities. The aim is for every young person to move to their next permanent placement within one term.

A short-stay secondary pathway that helps young people continue their learning and address gaps, make progress and build confidence in what they can achieve.

Part-time placement

- Placements for up to six weeks initially, with the possibility of extension if appropriate
- Reviews every three weeks with all stakeholders
- Academic and pastoral pathways followed

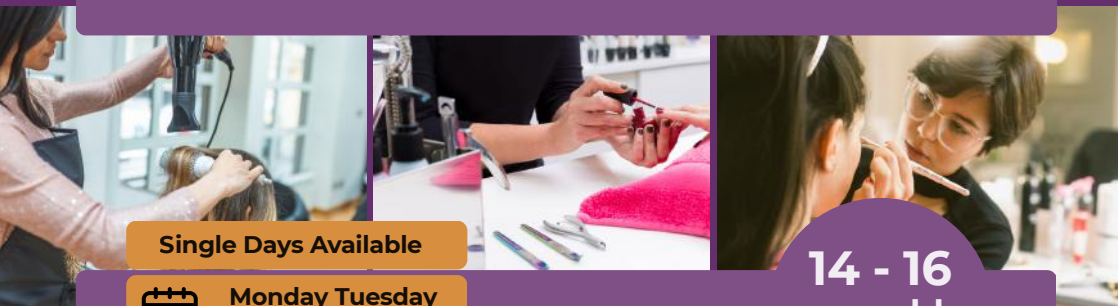

Re-engagement Intervention Workshops

Our Aim

Our aim is to offer the workshops to a small group of students in the local area who would benefit from targeted intervention with our skilled team. We hope that from these workshops students are able to reflect, learn support strategies to improve their outcomes and build upon their skills to enable them to be successful in a mainstream environment.



Workshops

The packages are offered to schools in a six-week block where each student will receive two 45 minute sessions on a weekly basis. In total, each student will receive 12 intervention sessions and return to school with an exit report and a work booklet record of their sessions.

The workshops will run between 12:30pm and 3:00pm and schools are responsible for arranging transport to and from our site.

There will be limited spaces available for each six week block of intervention sessions with a maximum of 4 students per package.
